### 1. Introduction

GUMCAD is the primary surveillance system for STIs in England. It was originally established in 2008 as a replacement for the KC60 Report, a paper-based report containing aggregated service-level data. The current version of GUMCAD is the third version in a series of surveillance improvements.

Genitourinary Medicine Clinic Activity Dataset (GUMCADv1) 2008 to 2011, replacing the KC60 report – data was originally required by Level 3 specialist (GUM) services only.

Genitourinary Medicine Clinic Activity Dataset (GUMCADv2) 2012 to 2019 – GUMCADv1 service coverage was expanded in 2012 to also include data from commissioned Level 2 non-specialist (non-GUM) services.

GUMCAD STI Surveillance System (GUMCADv3) 2019 onwards – surveillance coverage was expanded in 2018 to include:

- sexual behaviour
- alcohol and recreational drug use
- outcomes of partner notification
- the provision of PrEP
- SNOMED CT STI surveillance coding

This document provides guidance to frontline staff of commissioned NHS specialist (Level 3) sexual health services (SHS) who participated in the NHS PrEP Impact Trial to facilitate the recording and reporting of PrEP activity using PrEP data items (which have replaced PrEP SHHAPT codes).

This supplemental guidance should be read in conjunction with the <u>GUMCAD STI Surveillance</u> System clinical guidelines.

Detailed technical guidance for data managers and software providers of SHS is available in the GUMCAD STI Surveillance System data specification and technical guidance.

## PrEP activity coding – SHHAPT codes to data items

PrEP activity should now be recorded using the new PrEP data items – PrEP SHHAPT codes have been retired. The new PrEP data items allow PrEP activity to be reported with greater detail than was previously possible using the PrEP SHHAPT codes.

SHS should begin reporting PrEP activity using the new PrEP data items, instead of PrEP SHHAPT codes, as soon as their patient software systems (PSS) have been updated and the PrEP data items are available.

The following sections provide detailed guidance on how to transition from using SHHAPT codes to using data items to report PrEP activity – see <u>Appendix 1</u> for an updated PrEP activity coding algorithm using GUMCAD data items.

#### Noted changes are:

- PrEP offer and use is now reported using a combination of the PrEP\_Uptake and PrEP\_Regimen data items – see <u>section 2.2</u>
- stopping PrEP is now reported with a specific reason using the PrEP\_Stop\_Reason data item – see section 2.3
- PrEP six-monthly prescriptions can be reported using the data item
   PrEP Prescription: 180 tablets see section 2.4

# 2.1. PrEP eligibility (formerly SHHAPT O31, O32, O33)

PrEP eligibility should now be reported using the data item PrEP\_Eligibility. The coding options remain the same – select one code only.

## 2.2. PrEP use – uptake and regimen (formerly SHHAPT O41, O42, O43, O44)

The offer and use of PrEP should now be reported using a combination of the new data items PrEP\_Uptake and PrEP\_Regimen. The coding options remain the same – select one code per data item.

#### Please note:

- PrEP\_Uptake: Declined obtained at another source can also be coded for individuals that do not meet the eligibility criteria who are still acquiring PrEP from another source
- PrEP\_Regimen should also be recorded for those obtaining PrEP from another source
- PrEP\_Regimen should default to 'Not applicable' for those declining the offer of PrEP, that is data entry to specify 'Not applicable' should not be required in PSS

### 2.3. Stopping PrEP (formerly SHHAPT O45)

Stopping PrEP should now be reported using the new data item PrEP\_Stop\_Reason. The coding options have been expanded to include specific reasons for stopping PrEP. Please select one code only.

PrEP\_Stop\_Reason can also be reported for those who do not meet the eligibility criteria. For example, if an individual was obtaining PrEP at another source but has decided to stop.

## 2.4. PrEP prescription (formerly SHHAPT O51, O52, O53)

The number of tablets prescribed should now be reported using the new data item PrEP\_Prescription. The coding options have been expanded to include '180 tablets' (6 months supply) and 'Other amount'. Please select one code only.

Please note that the code for '180 tablets' was added to the code list in October 2019. If your PSS does not yet include the new code, please report '180 tablets' using the code for 'Other amount' (until your PSS has been updated).

Please note that SHHAPT coding does not have a code option for 180 tablets – this should be reported as O53 (90 tablets) as a proxy until the new data items are available in your PSS.


### 2.5. Gender identity (formerly SHHAPT O60)

Gender identity should now be reported using a combination of the new data items Gender\_Identity and Gender\_Birth. Please select one code per data item.
