The Armed Forces Covenant

An Enduring Covenant Between

The People of the United Kingdom Her Majesty's Government

and –

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty. Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families. They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

Section 1: Principles of the Armed Forces Covenant

- 1.1 We **North Tower Consulting Ltd** will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:
 - no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen
 - In some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.

Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

2.1 We recognise the value serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families bring to our business and to our country. We will seek to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by:

Promoting the Armed Forces:

Promoting our work, activities and events through our own website and LinkedIn site

By publicising our Covenant on our website and displaying the Covenant logo

Promoting the fact that we are an Armed Forces friendly organisation, to our staff, contractors, customers, suppliers and wider public

Veterans:

Working with and advertising appropriate vacancies through Career Transition Partnership (CTP), as well as advertising widely through our veteran community, to ensure employment opportunities are known to other veterans, young and old

Welcoming Applications from and guaranteeing interviews with, veterans who meet the criteria in the job specification

Recognising military skills and qualifications in our recruitment and selection process

Service Spouses & Partners:

Supporting the employment of Service spouses and partners by welcoming applications from spouses/partners who meet the criteria in the job specifications

Endeavouring to offer a degree of flexibility in granting leave for services spouses and partners before, during and after a partner's deployment

Reserves:

Support employees who are already members of the Reserve Force

Staff will be supported to consider becoming a Reservist

Granting additional paid/unpaid leave for annual Reserve Forces training where possible

Supporting any mobilisations and deployment

• Cadet Organisations:

Supporting employees who wish to become volunteer leaders in military cadet organisations

Granting additional leave to attend annual training camps and courses where possible

Promote support to local military cadet units

Recognising the benefits of employing cadets/ex-cadets within the workforce

National Events:

Supporting Armed Forces Day, Reserves Day, the Poppy Appeal Day and Remembrance activities

Armed Forces Charities:

Supporting Armed Forces charities and staff who volunteer to assist

Any additional commitments the company wishes to make:

Veterans and Service Leavers will be offered advice on applying for opportunities
