

PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about the import of dogs, which we received on 1 June 2021. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000.

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"Please could I request the figures for the following:

1. Number of dogs commercially imported (under the Balai Directive) in each of the following years: 2011 - 2020 (broken down by year and country)."

The data that you requested for the number of dogs commercially imported (under the Balai Directive) in each of the following years: 2016 - 2020 broken down by year and country can be found in Appendix 1. Only information from 2016 is available on TRACES.

"2. Number of dogs imported via the PETS scheme in each of those years (again broken down by year and country)."

The number of dogs imported via the PETS scheme can be found in the table below. APHA do not hold any PETS information prior to 2018. The country of origin of compliant animals imported under the PETS scheme is not recorded.

We do not have any PETS information prior to 2018 as it is outside our 3 year data retention period, and is no longer held by us.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
