JUDGMENT

- In respect that no response in these proceedings has been presented to the Employment Tribunal office within the relevant time limit, the Employment Judge, in terms of Rule 21 of Schedule 1 to the Employment Tribunals (Constitution and Rules of Procedure) Regulations 2013, now issues the following Judgment:-
- The claim under section 23 of the Employment Rights Act 1996 is well-founded and the respondent shall pay to the claimant the sum of £4259.33 as unlawful deductions from wages consisting of £2847.95 unpaid wages, £60 in tips, £287.71 unpaid pension payments and £1063.76 statutory sick pay.
- 302. The respondent shall pay to the claimant the sum of £615 as damages for breach of contract (failure to give notice of termination of employment).
