3. Health Attestation:

I, the undersigned official veterinarian authorised by the competent authority, certifies that the animal(s) identified above satisfies(y) the following requirements:

1. The animals come from an establishment under the official supervision of the competent authority of the country of origin and were kept at the establishment of origin for at least 6 months prior to departure / since birth.

2. The animal(s) were examined by an officially authorised veterinarian in the 24 hrs prior to departure and found to be fit to travel and without clinical signs of disease.

3. The animal(s) showed no clinical sign of rabies on the day prior to or on the day of shipment.

4. The animal(s) come from a country where rabies is a disease subject to compulsory notification to the competent authorities.

5. The animal(s) have been vaccinated against Rabies 30 days or more prior to shipment, OR

there have been no cases of rabies in any animals at the approved holding, for the last 12 months.

6. The animal(s) have not come into contact with other animals not complying with at least the same health requirements described in this certificate for the last 3 months and were not (an) animal(s) to be killed under a national programme for the eradication of disease.

7. The animals have been loaded for despatch to Denmark in the means of transport and/or containers that were cleaned and disinfected before loading with an officially authorised disinfectant and so constructed that faeces, urine, litter or feed could not flow or fall out of the vehicle or container during transportation.
