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Thank you for your email of 16 August in which you requested the following information:

- "1. What is the total number of flying hours logged for the Watchkeeper unmanned aerial vehicle programme as of 1.4.21 and how many of these hours have been on operations?
- 2. Other than WK031, WK06, WK43, WK42 and WK50, have any other of these aircraft been lost or damaged beyond repair? If so please provide me with details of the accident/loss giving the date of the incident, where it took place and a brief summary of the circumstances.
- 3. How many Watchkeeper UAV his Department has purchased since 2005; and how many have been delivered to the department since 2005."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some of the information in scope of your request is held and is below.

- 1. As at 1 April 2021 there had been 3147 hours and 49 minutes flown, of these, 212 hours and 55 minutes were operational.
- I can confirm that there was a minor incident involving a Watchkeeper at RAF Akrotiri, Cyprus on 14 October 2020. This has resulted in damage to the aircraft and components. A full investigation is currently underway and as such the MoD cannot comment further at this time.
- 3. I can advise that this information is exempt under Section 21 of the FOIA, because it is reasonably accessible to you by other means. It is already in the public domain and can be found at the following link and by navigating to table 7: https://www.gov.uk/government/statistics/uk-armed-forces-equipment-and-formations-2020
