# PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information regarding imports of live animals for the exotic pet trade, which we received on 6 August 2019. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI).

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"I am writing to make a freedom of information request on data of live animal imports relating to the exotic pet trade held on the Trade Control and Expert System (TRACES) database, or held otherwise. I would like data relating to the number of non-domesticated animals imported to the UK for commercial purposes, including both imports from non-EU countries and EU trade into the UK. Please provide available data, listing the number of live animals imported for each of the past 5 years:

- Broken down by calendar year (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018)
- Broken down by species or lowest available taxonomic category •
- Including the country of origin
- Including the country from where consigned
- Including the animal source (wild-caught, captive-bred, ranched etc.) if available
- Including the purpose for import (commercial, zoo, private collection etc.) if available
- Including all reptiles, amphibians, birds, non-domesticated mammals
- Excluding plants, fish, invertebrates
- Excluding all livestock
- Excluding other domesticated mammals: cat, dog, guinea pig, donkey, horse, ferret, rabbit, fancy mouse, fancy rat. Please include other mammals not on this list whose status as domesticated or not is uncertain

Please provide any necessary data keys to enable me to interpret the data sets provided if not set out as above."

We then received clarity that this request was for both endangered animals, and those not in danger.

All the information, including 2018 figures, are already available in the public domain on the CITIES Trade Database regarding the exotic species imports into the UK; and any other country where they have provided their yearly returns to the CITES Secretariat. Attached at Appendix 1 is the information regarding animals not in danger. The information provided is a true reflection of the data that we have access to. APHA cannot guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input into TRACES by a third party.

TRACES does not record the animal source (wild-caught, captive-bred, ranched etc.). TRACES also does not record the purpose of import as the exotic pet trade, and as such this data covers all commercial imports of the specified animals. The purpose for import (commercial, zoo, private collection etc.) has not been provided as TRACES does not break down the purpose of import in this manner.
