Thank you for your email of 19 August 2021, enclosing correspondence from your constituent, has asked:

"I'm presently researching the system of prisoner of war camps in Britain in the immediate period after World War 2. I am particularly interested in Camp 122 which was located in Uxbridge Road, Hatch End, during 1946-7. I have seen File FO 939/308 at the National Archives. However, I would like to also see any other material held by HM Government. I would be very grateful if you could approach the FO or MOD to find out whether they hold any information."

Mr request is being treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that none of the information in scope of his request is held. Any existing information with regard to his enquiry will have been transferred to The National Archives, where he has already made approaches for assistance.
