### REQUEST FOR INFORMATION - INFORMATION RELATING TO THE DEATH OF WILLIAM MARCHANT ON 28 APRIL 1987

I can confirm that your request has been considered under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI (A)), and the process is now complete.

You stated the following:

"I am writing to, concerning the murder of Mr William Marchant - 28 April 1987. I would request all information held by the MOD, in relation to the Weapons Intelligence Section's taskings and findings, in relation to the above mater. This should include minutes of tasking meetings, liaison meetings and correspondence with outside agencies; and any finalised reports and a list of those furnished with such."

I can confirm that the MOD holds some information relating to the death of William Marchant. Please find attached at Annex A a copy of 2 Section Weapons Intelligence Unit report dated 28 April 1987. I can confirm that we do not hold the photographs referred to in the report.

Thank you for clarifying in your e-mail dated 8 March that you required all reports relating to the Weapons Intelligence Sections tasking meetings, liaison meetings and correspondence with outside agencies and any finalised reports and a list of those furnished with such. I can confirm that we do not hold any such documents, bar the report copied at Annex A.

Some of the information you have requested could be exempt under Section 23(1) of the Freedom of Information Act, which relates to the bodies dealing with security matters, although it is also possible that the information relates to none of the bodies dealing with security matters. Sections 23(1) and 24(1) are being cited in the alternative as it is not appropriate, in the circumstances of the case, to say which of the two exemptions is actually engaged so as not to undermine national security or reveal the extent of any involvement, or not, of the bodies dealing with security matters. Section 23 is an absolute exemption and, if it were engaged in this material, the MOD would not be required to consider whether the public interest favours disclosure of this information.

Any information that is not exempt from disclosure under Section 23(1) could be exempt under Section 24(1) of the FOI(A), which exempts information from disclosure if its exemption is required for the purpose of safeguarding national security. We cannot say which of the two exemptions is actually engaged, but to the extent that S24(1) might be engaged. We acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency, but we consider that there is a stronger public interest in protecting national security.

All Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) cases remain open and if new evidence comes forward the PSNI will reinvestigate. Release of these documents must be carefully considered under Section 31 (Law Enforcement) of the FOI(A).

I have completed this consideration through a public interest test including consultation with the PSNI who have advised that release of some of the information could adversely impact on any investigative process and may jeopardise any future prosecutorial process. On this basis I am withholding some of the information under Section 31 of the FOI(A).

Section 38 (Health and Safety) is a qualified exemption and we have conducted a public interest test to determine whether the information should be released or withheld. The factors for this public interest have determined that whilst disclosure would demonstrate openness and transparency this is outweighed by the detrimental effect disclosure could have on those mentioned in the documents, or their family members and friends. I have concluded that whilst disclosure may be of historical interest, the health and safety of individuals must be taken into account. Some information has therefore been redacted under Section 38 of the FOI(A).

Additionally, some of the information contained within the disclosure constitutes personal information, such as names and addresses. Under FOI(A) this information is exempt under Section 40 (2) by reason of the first condition under Section 40 (3) (a) (i), as disclosure would contravene data protection principles under the Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA 2018). This is an absolute exemption and does not require a public interest test to be conducted in order for this information to be exempt from disclosure. Therefore, all personal information has been redacted.

I appreciate that this incident took place 33 years ago and the passage of time can be a factor in diminishing the applicability of exemptions to information. However, in this instance the passage of time is less relevant as the PSNI continue to investigate Troubles-related deaths and the overall balance is in favour of partial exemption.

#### DETAILS OF INCIDENT

- 1. On Tue 28 Apr 87, about 1505 hrs, a gold Marda 626 VRM: drove at speed along the Shankhill Road in the direction of Woodvale Road. As the car passed the Progressive Unionist Party office unknown person(s) opened fire in that direction fatally injuring William MARCHAUT.
- 2. The RUC were called to the scene where they found MARCHAHT laying on the pavement with an entry wound to the chest and an exit wound in the neck. He was still alive at this point and subsequently he was taken to the RVH where he later died.
- Progressive Unionist Party office. She sustained a minor flesh wound to her left leg.

- 8. PIRA carried out the assassination of William MARCHANT in retalliation to the murder of Larry MARLEY. William MARCHANT was a large figure of a man and easily recognised. He spent a lot of time along with other UVF men standing around outside the Progressive Unionist Party (PUP) office which made it easy for PIRA to find him.
- 9. It would appear that 5 shots were fired at MARCHANT as 3 strike marks were found on a lampost which he was stood next to, and 2 strike marks were found on the metal shutters to the PUP office. As the vehicle sped away several more shots were fired into the air some of which hit the top floors of two buildings.
- 10. The description of the vehicle might be wrong as the vehicle trace on came back as a belonging to of Belfast.


