

Thank you for your e-mail of the 8 December 2020 requesting the following information:

Can you please supply me with pdf copies of the minutes of any Dress Committee meetings from Feb 2019 to the present.

Please accept my apologies for the delay in responding to your request, which has been due to the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic and the effect on resources and necessary changes to our ways of working.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

Copies of the minutes of the Royal Air Force (RAF) Extraordinary Dress Policy Working Group February 2019 are attached at Annex A. Copies of the minutes of the RAF Clothing and Dress Policy Steering Group November 2019 and July 2020 are attached at Annex B and C.

In accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018, under S40(2) of the FOIA (third party personal data), information contained within the documents is withheld as exempt information. This is an Absolute Exemption and not subject to the Public Interest Test.



MINUTES OF THE EXTRAORDINARY RAF CLOTHING AND DRESS POLICY WORKING GROUP (DPWG) HELD AT RAF NORTHOLT ON 20 FEB 19



Qualification Badges. The ExWG saw no requirement to change or increase
the current range of RAF qualification badges. All applications for future Qualification
Badges should continue to follow the existing authorisation process, via Air A4 Log Spt
Commodities.

- Insignia for wear on shirts (No2 SD modes). A variety of metal badges
 depicting aircrew qualifications were viewed. A proposal to permit private purchase of
 the badges was not viewed favourably as potential for variations was considered
 significant.

- a. Decision. SG to consider cost implications of Service Supply.
- 7. Medal Ribbon bars for wear on shirts (No2 SD modes). The ExSG recognised that while medals were awarded there were fewer occasions where Ceremonial Dress was worn. Enabling the wearing of medal ribbon bars on No2 SD for certain events could be viewed as a positive move, especially for SP employed in International HQs. As with metal badges, the ExWG considered private purchase inappropriate.

DPSG

- a. Decision. SG to consider cost implications of Service Supply.
- 8. Additional comments. Concerns were raised in respect of statistic values presented, along with the costs of introducing Service Supplied accourtements as private purchase was not considered an appropriate avenue, especially if individuals were directed to purchase such items. Recruiting and retention statements were also challenged with Into Training Targets being noted as currently higher than previous years. Tailoring Contracts would also need to be considered in case of an uplift in volume. The ExWG were advised of a handover of CAS to take place in Summer 19 and that ratification of any SG endorsements would likely not occur until Autumn.

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

5. HUMINT badge. The DPSG endorsed the proposal to adopt the tri-Service Defence Human Intelligence badge for wear by FS and OR on the lower left sleeve of No1 uniform.

- 6. Wearing of 2* Accoutrements by Comdt RAFAC. The DPSG endorsed the wearing of embellished ceremonial shoulder boards and gold barrel sash by the Commandant RAF Air Cadets. This endorsement does not carry any further entitlements associated with 2* appointments (i.e. aiguillettes worn by personal staff).
 - Decision. Approved. Sec to advise originator.
- 7. Gender Neutral Dress Policies. A paper by Discip Pol is attached. The DPSG supported the proposals with the following observations:
- i) That ear studs, one in each or single ear, not exceeding 8mm diameter and of a single precious metal or gemstone may be worn by all personnel except when on ceremonial duties including parades.

- ii) That nail varnishes may be worn by all personnel but that colours/hues would need to be determined.
- iii) That hair style and dyed hair styles were applicable to all personnel, noting that direction would need to be sound to enable personnel to adhere according to the spirit of Service requirements. Section 40 stated that clarification would be needed in respect of Rastafarian personnel and the use of turbans.
- iv) To delete the current regulations within The Queen's Regulations and AP1358 in respect of concealed body piercing. The matter of body modification would need to be addressed in concert with medical and B&T advisors regarding workplace safety.

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v) The current 'Barely Black' 15D rule for hosiery would be reviewed from both an appearance and ecological perspective. a. Decision. ExCo review for approval 8. Tri-Service Items. The DPSG expressed concern in respect of adopting the accoutrements of Other Arms such as the maroon beret of Airborne Forces (16 Air Assault Brigade) and the green beret awarded on completion of the All Arms Commando Course. The preservation of the RAF blue/grey heritage was considered paramount and that identity should stand out within combined formations. The wearing of Other Arms qualification badges, such as the Submariner's badge, would require further consideration. a. Decision. Sec to draft tri-Service accoutrements brief. 9. Queen's Colour Squadron (QCS) Ceremonial Dress. Section 40 advised the DPSG that female Regt Officers and Gunners were potentially in scope for undertaking the QCS Ceremonial Course. The female Officer No1 is regarded as fit for purpose in a parade executive role, the female OR No1 had the potential to cause several problems in terms of appearance, excessive wear due to prolonged use beyond that experienced by the wider user group as well as unit cohesion and the inclusion of the Gunner. The Force Protection FC will propose a QCS female order of dress to AOC 2 for the consideration of DCom Ops. Attached to these minutes will be considered by the DPSG for amendments of the AP1358. a. Decision. DPSG to review ratification. 10. Formation Badge. The Eng & Logs Sqn Formation Badge request from RAF Scampton needed to provide numbers of personnel expected to wear the badge along with 'criteria' for doing so. a. Decision. Sec to advise originator. 11. Joint Terminal Attack Controller badge (J-TAC). To be discussed between CASWO and Other Service Cmd WOs for clarification. The will present a business case for the wearing of a qualification badge. 12.
