National Health Service Litigation Authority (Primary Medical Services – Dispute Resolution) Directions 2021

The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7(1) of the National Health Service Act 2006(a), gives the following Directions:

Citation, commencement, extent and application

- 1.—(1) These Directions may be cited as the National Health Service Litigation Authority (Primary Medical Services Dispute Resolution) Directions 2021 and come into force on the day after the day on which they are signed.
 - (2) These Directions are given to the National Health Service Litigation Authority(b).
 - (3) These Directions extend to England and Wales.
 - (4) These Directions apply in relation to England only.

Appointment of adjudicator

The National Health Service Litigation Authority is directed to exercise the Secretary of State's function of making a determination under section 9(8) of the National Health Service Act 2006 in relation to the dispute between AMP Healthcare Limited and Doncaster Clinical Commissioning Group which was referred to the Secretary of State by letter dated 23rd June 2021 from Acklam Bond Solicitors on behalf of AMP Healthcare Limited.
