## JUDGMENT

1. The First Claimant's claims (Mr Ammirati's) of unauthorised deductions from earnings (relating to wages owed, unpaid pension contributions and unpaid furlough monies), unpaid holiday pay, and breach of contract in the form of failure to pay notice pay, are all well-founded.
