Thank you for your email of 8 January 2022 requesting the following information:

'I have owned a landrover defender ambulance for ten years now that served between 1992 and 2003 vin/classis/frame NO. (SALLDKAV7JA910610) civilian reg number (J161MJL). I am desperately trying to find out its HISTORY in the armed forces and different places where it served its life please. So I can show its history at x military shows for the next generation of armed forces personnel.'

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and information about your vehicle has previously been published; Section 21(1) of the FOI Act provides that information is exempt if it reasonably available by other means. The Merlin archive was released as part of a previous FOI request and can be accessed at the Government publications website, at the following link:

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) of the FOI Act, I can advise you that the Merlin database in the above link is split into seven spreadsheets. The first has a list of vehicles, while sheets two through seven include the service histories. To search for a vehicle, you must press Ctrl + F on your computer keyboard, then select 'Options' and then select 'Workbook' from the 'Within' drop down list. Information relevant to your request can be found by typing the military vehicle registration number or chassis number and pressing 'enter'. For ease of reference,

The published information concerning your vehicle is available from the first attachment 'Merin 2.0 Attachment 1' at row 122954.

You may wish to note that when the Merlin database was archived into its current format some data may have been lost or corrupted. You should, therefore, be cautious that some of the data may be inaccurate.

I can confirm, there are no records held in the Joint Asset Management and Engineering Solutions database regarding this vehicle.

You may also wish to contact the Royal Logistic Corps Museum who might be able to assist your research further. The contact details for the museum are below. It is, however, possible that the Museum may charge to use its services.
