We refer to your email dated 26 July 2021 to the Ministry of Defence Police which was acknowledged on 27 July 2021.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

I have a question? When Police officers undertake training, they deal with public information ,how they collect it? use it?

Are new recruits, PSCO and Constables equipped with ICO GDPR New ruling 2018.

Police Body Cams v ICO Domestic CCTV new code? One protects! Other code prevents street/neighbour anarchy and breach to privacy and freedom

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

When Police officers undertake training, they deal with public information ,how they collect it? use it?

Are new recruits, PSCO and Constables equipped with ICO GDPR New ruling 2018.

Ministry of Defence Police do not employ PCSOs. All new recruits must complete a Defence training course entitled Defence Information Management Passport-Information Matters. In addition to this the force has a dedicated Data Protection officer and Police Information Manager that all officers are able to access.
