## Notes on the Table

1. The information in the table is derived from the number of CTF vouchers issued and the number of accounts opened by parents as reported by providers to HMRC. Vouchers are issued in respect of CTF eligible children born between 1 September 2002 and 2 January 2011.

2. HMRC ceased issuing vouchers from 31 October 2012 and all vouchers had to be used by 31 December 2012. Where vouchers were not used HMRC opened an account in the child's name. So children who received a voucher should now have had an account opened for them by their parents or HMRC.

3. Some additional CTF eligible children have been identified who did not receive a CTF voucher. The number of additional CTF accounts opened for them by HMRC is not statistically significant.

4. These statistics fall outside the scope of National Statistics. Totals and percentages are derived from unrounded statistics.
