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### Notes on the Table

1. The information in the table is derived from the number of CTF vouchers issued and the number of accounts opened by parents as reported by providers to HMRC. Vouchers are issued in respect of CTF eligible children born between 1 September 2002 and 2 January 2011.
2. HMRC ceased issuing vouchers from 31 October 2012 and all vouchers had to be used by 31 December 2012. Where vouchers were not used HMRC opened an account in the child's name. So most children eligible for a CTF have now had an account opened for them by their parents or HMRC.
3. Only a small number of additional accounts are opened when further CTF eligible children are identified. So the total number of accounts opened as at 15 January 2014, including those opened by HMRC, is not significantly above the 6.344m reported in September 2013.
4. These statistics fall outside the scope of National Statistics. Totals and percentages are derived from unrounded statistics.
5. The next set of statistics will be published in April 2014.
