We have a document to prove this as attached. (Certificate of the purchase of the Empress of India dated 7 June 1978 confirming purchase took place 10 April 1978.).

as follows:

We were informed at time of purchase that the propellers were removed prior to sale to us. We have however since been informed the wreck has been sold to a German based company that the engine rooms have been removed. We invite your comments.'

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed and I can confirm that after an extensive search of DESA's records, no information in scope of your request is held.
