JUDGMENT

The unanimous decision of the Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant was unfairly dismissed for a reason falling within the scope of section 152(1)(ba) of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.
- 2. The respondent subjected the claimant to detriments on grounds related to union membership or activities (section 146(1)(ba) of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992).
- 3. The respondent acted in breach of contract by dismissing the claimant without notice.
- 4. The respondent failed to comply with section 10(4) of the Employment Relations Act 1999.
- 5. The respondent shall pay compensation to the claimant of £37,915.31, made up as follows:
 - a. A basic award for unfair dismissal of £6,203.00;
 - b. A compensatory award for unfair dismissal of £11,314.61;
 - c. Compensation for injury to feelings resulting from detriments on grounds related to union membership or activities of £10,000.00;
 - d. Compensation for breach of contract of £2,227.12;

e. An uplift of 25% on the above figures pursuant to section 207A of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992 amounting to £7,436.18; and

f. An award under section 11 of the Employment Relations Act 1999 of £734.40.
