I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). I can confirm that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds some information within the scope of your request. However, this information is exempt under Section 21 of the FOIA (Information reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means).

Under Section 16 of the FOI Act (Advice and Assistance), the MOD often publish case studies which include aspects of campaigns including social media via the Government Communications Service Blog via the link below.

Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the
