Thank you for your email of 22 September 2021 requesting the following information:

"I seek answers to the following questions:

a. Has DESA had HMS Ariadne's ship's bell in its possession at any time since HMS Ariadne (F72) paid off in 1992?

b. If it had the bell and no longer does, how was the bell disposed of?

- c. If it was sold was this by public auction?
- d. If not by public auction how was the sale arranged?"

I have treated your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that no information in scope of your request is held.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may wish to note that the Defence Equipment Sales Authority (DESA) have confirmed that they have never had HMS Ariadne's ship's bell in their possession. Furthermore, after an extensive search of their records, they have also confirmed that they do not hold any recorded information relating to this bell so are unable to comment further. I am aware that you have also contacted the Royal Navy about the bell, and I can only confirm that DESA's findings match what the Royal Navy advised you in their response dated 17 September 2021, reference FOI2021/10243. Regrettably, no recorded information is held by the MOD to determine how the ship's bell from HMS Ariadne was disposed of.
