Re: S31 Grant Determination Letter for the Opportunity Areas Early Identification of Autism Grant, March 2022 (2021-22 DLUHC 31/5925)

This Determination is made between:

- (1) The Secretary of State for Education and
- (2) The local authorities listed at Annex A.

I am pleased to confirm details of the Government's offer to the council following agreement that the Opportunity Areas (OAs) Early Identification of Autism grant would be devolved.

We are devolving this grant under a Section 31, non-ringfenced transfer (Local Government Act 2003). Our expectation is that the council will use the funds to support the roll out of the Early Identification of Autism project. The Senior Responsible Owner for this grant, Elizabeth Franey, will require your responsible officer to confirm at the end of the financial year that the funding has been properly expended.

We have discussed and agreed the specific amounts for each area with the DfE Early Identification of Autism project lead, who works closely with local partners. A total of £100,109 was paid on 3 March 2022 to the local authorities listed in Annex A.

Purpose of the Grant

The Council can spend this grant to deliver the Early Identification of Autism project, in line with the delivery plan for this agreed with DfE. This may involve contracting with a third party for some or all of the expenditure. The local authority may also, where agreed with the DfE, use the grant to pay salary costs for any staff employed through the local authority to deliver to project, and to fund any "new burdens" and

cover reasonable expenses associated with administering this grant (such as for procurement and contract management costs).

Arrangements for keeping in touch with the Department for Education

Formal reporting to the Department for Education on progress is not a condition of this grant. The Department for Education will, however, ask the Council to provide a voluntary end of year return and report confirming activity that has taken place or been funded.

This letter has been copied to the Directors of Children's Services in the participating local authorities; Her Majesty's Treasury; the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities; and relevant DfE staff.
