## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: POLICE OFFICERS AFFECTED BY MENTAL HEALTH.

We refer to your email dated 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to the Ministry of Defence Police which was acknowledged on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2022.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

I am writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 on the number of police officers within your force affected by mental health issues, and the number of working days lost due to mental health-related sick days.

Please would you send me;

For 2019;

- A. The number of individual police officers within your force to have reported mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)
- B. The number of individual police officers within your force to have had one or more days sick leave because of mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)

C. The total number of days police officers have been absent because of sick days due to mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)

For 2020;

- A. The number of individual police officers within your force to have reported mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)
- B. The number of individual police officers within your force to have had one or more days sick leave because of mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)
- C. The total number of days police officers have been absent because of sick days due to mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)

For 2021;

- A. The number of individual police officers within your force to have reported mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)
- B. The number of individual police officers within your force to have had one or more days sick leave as a result of mental health issues (including a breakdown of depression, anxiety, PTSD, stress...etc.)

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

MOD Police can only categorise absence of this nature into the single group of: 'Anxiety, Depression and Stress', there is no lower level of granularity recorded. On that basis, totals are as follows for the three calendar years requested.

2020	108	8,571
2021	110	7,844

The data shown is for Uniformed Police Officers only.
