JUDGMENT

- 1. The complaint of unfair dismissal is well-founded. The Claimant is therefore awarded £15,363.55 (comprised of a basic award of £3,493.35 gross and a compensatory award of £11,870.20 net of tax).
- 2. The Claimant's complaint that there was an unauthorised deduction from his wages in respect of holiday pay is well-founded. The Claimant is therefore awarded the sum of £620.78 gross.
- 3. The Claimant's claim for notice pay is well-founded and he is awarded £2,483.12 (*calculated at 8 weeks x £310.39*) net of tax.
- 4. The complaint that he was not paid "furlough payments" is not well founded and is dismissed.

5. Where a sum has been awarded gross, the Claimant is responsible for any income tax or employee national insurance contributions which may become due.

6. The Respondent's Employer's Contract Claim is not well founded, and is dismissed.
