Thank you for your emails of 31 January 2022 and 16 February 2022 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

You originally asked:

"I would like to make a freedom of information request of the Ministry of Defence about the amount paid by the UK Government to supplement the salaries of armed forces personnel who would otherwise be affected by Scottish income tax. I would like to know: i) the number of personnel affected ii) the average amount paid to each individual

iii) the total amount paid to all individuals."

You clarified as follows on 16 February 2022: *"I would like it in the financial year 2020-1 please".*

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has been completed and I can confirm that all the information is held and provided below.

The information below was extracted from the Joint Personnel Administration Management System on 23 February 2022 and includes all UK Regular Service personnel in the Royal Navy, Army and RAF.

In Financial Year 2020/21, 6,950 Regular Service personnel received a Tax Mitigation payment. The average amount paid was £929.10, and the overall amount paid was £6,457,000.

Please note that in line with the Office of National Statistics' policy on rounding, the payment recipient data has been rounded to the nearest 10 and the overall payment value has been rounded to the nearest 1,000.
