Data on responses to correspondence from MPs and Peers Members' Correspondence in 2020

The Government attaches great importance to the effective and timely handling of correspondence. The Cabinet Office is publishing this correspondence data to enable transparency and to demonstrate the total volume of correspondence received by Government Departments and Agencies from Members of Parliament and Peers in the calendar year 2020.

The deadlines set by Government Departments and Agencies for responding to correspondence from Members of Parliament and Peers should not exceed 20 working days, and Departments and Agencies are advised to consider setting more challenging deadlines than 20 working days to ensure a better minimum service level.

In comparison to 2019, 2020 saw an overall 81% increase in the volume of correspondence from Members of Parliament and Peers across Government, primarily due to the Covid-19 pandemic, with an average of 70% of correspondence responded to within the response targets set by Departments and Agencies.

Departments with more challenging response targets than 20 working days were provided with the optional choice of displaying their performance against the maximum target of 20 working days as well, to provide the opportunity for a more accurate comparison across Government.

Annex

* In the first quarter of 2020 the target response time for the Cabinet Office was 15 working days, but this was changed to 20 working days. The percentage of cases responded to on time is calculated separately per quarter for the annual year of 2020 and then combined in order to accurately reflect performance data. The correspondence division of the Department for Exiting the European Union was absorbed into the Cabinet Office on January 31st 2020. Correspondence data for this Department is included with the Cabinet Office data from January 1st 2020.

** In addition to written correspondence, PHE set up an MP email helpline. 2,504 emails were received, with a target response time of 1 working day, 87% of which were on time, 98% of which were achieved within 20 working days.

*** The Department for International Development was merged with the Foreign and Commonwealth Office to become the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office on 1st September 2020. Results are published for the first nine months of 2020 for each Department separately and combined the annual data for the FCDO for the full year of 2020.

**** These are cases drafted by HMRC policy and signed by HM Treasury Ministers.

***** NIO Records do not allow for separation between correspondence received from Members of Parliament/Peers and other Ministerial correspondence, therefore the data shown incorporates both.
