**SECTION III. HEALTH INFORMATION**

I, \_\_\_\_\_, an official veterinarian authorised by the UK competent veterinary authority hereby certifies that the horse described above meeting the following requirements:

- a) It has come from a country where the following diseases are compulsorily

notifiable: African Horse Sickness, Dourine, Glanders, Equine Encephalomyelites (all types including VEE) Equine Infectious Anaemia, Vesicular Stomatitis, Rabies, Anthrax.

- b) The horse was examined today<sup>(1)</sup> and showed no clinical signs of disease.
- c) The horse is not intended for slaughter under a national programme of infectious or contagious disease eradication.
- d) The horse has not been outside BAHRAIN for a continuous period of more than 30 days and was imported into the UK (the country of dispatch) on (date) since import it has been resident on holdings under veterinary supervision, accommodated in separated stables without coming into contact with equidae of lower health status except during racing, competition or cultural events.
- e) It comes from the territory on in cases of official regionalisation, agreed by the Kingdom of Bahrain, from a part of the territory or territory of a third country in which:
- i) Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis has not occurred during the last 6 months.
  - ii) Dourine has not occurred during the last 6 months.
  - iii) Glanders has not occurred during the last 6 months.
- f) It does not come from a territory or part of a territory of a third country considered, in accordance with OIE definitions, as infected with African Horse Sickness.
- g) It does not come from a holding which was subject to prohibition for animal health reasons nor had contact with equidae from a holding which was subject to prohibition for animal health reasons:
- i) During the last 6 months in case of Equine Encephalomyelitis, beginning on the date on which the Equidae suffering from the disease are slaughtered.
  - ii) In the case of Equine Infectious Anaemia, until the date on which, the infected animals having been slaughtered, the remaining animals have shown a negative reaction to 2 Coggins tests carried out 3 months apart.
  - iii) During 6 months in the case of Vesicular Stomatitis.
  - iv) During 6 months in the case of Equine Viral Arteritis.
  - v) During one month from the last recorded case, in the case of Rabies.
  - vi) During 15 days from the last recorded case, in the case of Anthrax.

If all the animals of species susceptible to the disease located on the holding have been slaughtered and the premises disinfected, the period of prohibition shall be 30 days, beginning on the day on which the animals were destroyed and the premises disinfected, except in the case of Anthrax, where the period of prohibition is 15 days.

- h) To the best of my knowledge, it has not been in contact with Equidae suffering from an infectious or contagious disease in the 15 days prior to this declaration.

**SECTION IV**

- a) The horse will be sent in a vehicle cleansed and disinfected in advance withing a disinfectant officially recognised in the country of dispatch and designed in a way that droppings , litter or fodder cannot escape during transportation.
- b) Residency declarations provided and signed by the owner or representative are attached to this certificate.

**SECTION V**

The certificate is valid for 10 days. In case of transport by ship the time is prolonged by the time of the voyage.
