I the undersigned,
Official Veterinarian, hereby certify:

- a) The premises of origin stated at II(b) above where the animal has been kept is a licensed zoo or wildlife park, which is licenced to hold non-domestic carnivores.
- b) The premises of origin is under veterinary supervision, where the health of the animals is monitored so incursions of disease are identified and control and/or eradication measures can be applied and operates a documented animal health monitoring programme, including microbiological and parasitological tests as well as necropsies.
- c) The animal for export has been continuously resident in the premises of origin since birth or for 12 months prior to certification.
- d) No case or other evidence of Aleutian disease, Aujeszky's disease, babesiosis, brucellosis, pseudo tuberculosis, transmissible spongiform encephalopathy, trichinosis, trypanosomiasis, tuberculosis or tularaemia has been diagnosed at the premises of origin during the 12 months prior to certification in any animal of the same phylogenetic family as the export animal(s).
- e) The premises of origin has remained free from any evidence of rabies during the 12 months prior to certification.
- f) Each animal has been individually identified with an International Standards Organisation (ISO) compliant microchip, and the site of the implantation and the identification number of the animal has been recorded in part I of this certificate.
- g) The animal was isolated from other animals not of the same health status and residency status for 30 days prior to the scheduled date of export and remained free from clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease until certification.
- h) The animal was treated for internal parasites with broad spectrum parasiticides during the 30 days prior to export on

- j) I have inspected the animal within 72 hours prior export and found it to be:
 - (i) free from infectious or contagious disease
 - (ii) visibly free from fleas, ticks and other external parasites
 - (iii) healthy and fit to travel.
- k) The individual health record for the animal is attached to this certificate.
- l) After due enquiry, I am satisfied that the transport container that the animal is to be shipped in meets container requirements specified in International Air Transport Association (IATA) Live Animals Regulations.
- m) After due enquiry, I am satisfied that the container is either new* or was cleaned and disinfected* and if made of timber was treated against insect infestation or fumigated* prior to the loading of the animal.
- n) After due enquiry, I am satisfied that the animal will have no contact with other animals during transport not of the same export consignment.
- o) The animal was sealed in its travel container with tamper-evident seals before leaving the pre-export facility for the port of export. The seal number is
