In addition to the safe storage and handling of fertiliser advice available from your supplier and from the Agricultural Industries Confederation (AIC) and the HSENI 'Basic Guidance on the Storage and Handling of Ammonium Nitrate Based Fertilisers' leaflet, farmers should take note of information provided in this leaflet.
