

We also work with the **Care Quality Commission (CQC)** to make sure children with **SEND** get the support they need from health and care services, schools and colleges.



Care Quality Commission (CQC) is a government organisation that checks the standard of health and social care services in England.



SEND stands for **S**pecial **E**ducational **N**eeds and **D**isabilities. Children and young people with SEND are aged 0 to 25 and need some extra support to learn and grow.

In 2014, the government made a law that said local services have to help children and young people with SEND.

The law had a list of things that local services must do.



Since 2016, we have been checking that services do what the law says they need to do. But now we want to do more.



We will still check that local services are following the law.

But we also want to check that what they are doing is making the lives of children and young people better.



We want to use our visits to understand what it is like to be a child or young person with SEND where you live.

What we want to do




We think we should look at how well local services:

 Make sure you get the right help at the right time.




 Make sure you are ready for what you want to do next, like start college or look for a job, and are able to do more for yourself.
