Frequently asked questions

How did you choose me to take part?

You were randomly chosen from people aged 40-75 on 24th January 2020 who took part in the Family Resources Survey between April 2017 and June 2018. Only people who agreed to be contacted again were included in the selection of people being invited to take part in the Preparing for the Future study.

What will happen to any information I give?

We will handle your data in accordance with data protection legislation. Anonymised survey data will be shared with DWP for statistical and research purposes only. Your answers will be put together with those from everyone else taking part in the study. Any findings reported will not identify anyone who took part in the study.

Who is carrying out the study?

NatCen Social Research are conducting this study for the Department for Work and Pensions.
