

Obligations Regarding Sales Notes

Summary

This document is intended to be used by all sellers and buyers of 'first-sale' fish (except quantities of less than 30 kg when purchased for personal consumption) and Marine Enforcement Officers (MEO).

It is a mandatory requirement, in law, for registered buyers of 'First Sale' fish to record details of their purchase in a document referred to as a 'Sales Note'.

This document is intended to help you¹ understand more about your obligations as the purchaser of 'First Sale' fish with regard to the Fisheries Administration Sales Note. However, it is not a comprehensive guide to UK legislation for the fishing industry. It is to be used as a guide; not as a definitive interpretation of UK legislation.

¹ Where the term 'you' is used in this document, this always refers to the purchaser of 'First Sale' fish

⁻ this being defined as: fish being marketed for the first time.



1 Why you need to record the details of your purchase of 'First Sale' fish

UK Law states that you, the buyer or seller of 'First Sale' fish are required to accurately record the details of your transaction on a Fisheries Administration Sales Note.

This document is intended to help you understand more about your obligations as the seller or purchaser of First Sale fish with regard to the Sales Note. However, it is not a comprehensive guide to UK legislation for the fishing industry. It is to be used as a guide; not as a definitive interpretation of the legislation.

Information shown in the appendices of this document is for guidance only. The information is subject to change without notice, so you may need to contact your local MMO Office to ensure you are up-to-date with the current legislative requirements.

The figure you record on the Sales Note shall be the figure resulting from the weighing². It is not necessarily the same as that recorded in the Fishing Logbook by the Master of the fishing vessel.

You must always remember that it is the **responsibility of the Seller or the Buyer of First Sale Fish** to ensure that all the information recorded in the Fisheries Administration Sales Note is accurate.

2 Who needs to use a Fisheries Administration Sales Note – and what type?

All purchasers of 'First Sale' fish are required to complete a Fisheries Administration Sales Note.

This includes ALL registered buyers, registered auctions or registered fish markets and other registered bodies or persons authorised by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO).

2.1 If your annual financial turnover in first sales of fisheries products is less than £175 000

A 'paper', or 'electronic' (preferred), format Sales Note is required to be completed.

2.2 If your annual financial turnover in first sales of fisheries products is £175 000 or more

An 'electronic' (computerised) Sales Note is required to be completed.

2.3 You may not need to use a Sales Note if you meet certain conditions

To be exempt from completing a Sales Note you need to meet the following condition:

If you have purchased no more than 30 kg of fish products which are to be used only for private consumption and therefore not sold on the market.

What information needs to be recorded on the Sales Note?

The information recorded on the Sales Note must include the following details:



- 1. The name and identification number of the fishing vessel that has landed the fish product you have bought.
- 2. The port and date of landing the fish product.
- 3. The name of the Master (or the operator) of the fishing vessel. If you have bought your fish from a different source you must record the name of the seller.
- 4. Your name, as the buyer, and your VAT number, tax identification number, or other unique identifier.
- 5. The FAO alpha-3 code of each species and the relevant geographical area in which the catches were taken.

Note: This must include details of the relevant geographical area of capture: FAO area, sub-area and sub-division, ICES division, NAFO, NEAFC sub-area, CECAF area, GFCM sub area or third country fishing zone.

Note: The geographical area to be recorded is the relevant ICES area. Refer to Appendix 3 for an approximate map showing these areas.

Note: Species must be recorded using the 3-Alpha FAO fish species codes. A list of the most common species can be found in Appendix 4 of this document.

6. The quantities of each species in kilograms in product weight, broken down by type of product presentation or the number of individuals if the relevant quota is managed on the basis of individuals.



Note: The figure resulting from the weighing shall be used for the completion of sales notes. Refer to: Document No.: H8.10-G061 - Obligations Regarding the Weighing of Fish Catches.

Note: Species must be recorded using the Product Presentation 3Alpha Codes. A list of these can be found in Appendix 5 of this document.

- 7. For all products subject to marketing standards³, as appropriate, the individual size or weight, grade, presentation and freshness.
- 8. if you have any species that are below the applicable minimum conservation reference size, these must be recorded in terms of:
 - the quantity (net weight in kg) or the number of individual species
 - details of the location where they are being stored

Note: Refer to <u>Landing Obligation</u> and <u>Recording Catches of Fish</u> <u>below Minimum Size</u> (see References).

- 9. The place and the date of the sale.
- 10. Where possible, record the following information:
 - the reference number and date of invoice
 - where appropriate, the reference number and date of the sales contract

³ Reference should be made to Article 33 and Article 34 of Regulation (EU) No. 1379/2013 – Common Marketing Standards. Article 34 (Compliance with Common Marketing Standards) states:

^{1.} The products intended for human consumption for which common marketing standards are laid down may be made available on the UK market only in accordance with those standards.

^{2.} All fishery products landed, including those that do not comply with common marketing standards, may be used for purposes other than direct human consumption, including fish meal, fish oil, pet food, food additives, pharmaceuticals or cosmetics.



This legislation should be read in conjunction with UK fisheries rules Regulations 2018

- 11. Where applicable, record the following information:
 - record the reference number of the take-over declaration
 - record the reference number of the transport document
- 12. The price you paid for the fish.

Note: Examples of Fisheries Administration Sales Notes are illustrated in Appendices 1 and 2.

4 What to do with the information recorded on the Sales Note

a) If your annual financial turnover in first sales of fisheries products is less than £175 000:

You, the buyer, must submit your (paper) Sales Note, or send it electronically, to the local MMO Office within 48 hours of purchasing your fish.

b) If your annual financial turnover in first sales of fisheries products is £175 000 or more:

You, the buyer, must transmit your (electronic) Sales Note, to the MMO within 24 hours of purchasing your fish using the UK Electronic Reporting System (ERS).

4.1.1 Registering for the UK Electronic Reporting System

Before you can use the ERS you have to register. To register, you must either complete Section D of the RBS1 form when you first register as a buyer or seller or, if you are already a registered buyer/seller, sign up at any time using the form RBS5. Registration is free.

Send your completed application form to the Registration of Buyers and Sellers department of the MMO (refer to Section 5 of this document).

Once your application has been processed you will receive login details for the secure ERS Website.

4.1.2 Using the UK Electronic Reporting System

The UK Electronic Reporting System (ERS) allows you to submit sales notes electronically using one of the following methods:

- 1. Direct data entry through the ERS website suitable if you purchase small quantities of fish.
- 2. Send a Comma Separated Variable (CSV) file (e-mailed) to the ERS hub. The e-mail address is: salesnote.live@fishhub.net (you can use this to submit a file containing multiple sales notes).
- 3. Use an Application Programmable Interface (API). This provides access to the ERS web service and enables you to download sales notes from your existing database. An API developer's pack is available on the ERS website.
- 4. Using a predefined spreadsheet template supplied by the UK Fisheries Authorities ('Option 5'). As a buyer you can use this spreadsheet template to submit a single sales note or multiple sales notes.








Appendix 2 Example of a Completed Fisheries Administration Sales Note (Paper)
