# Summary of Service

- 1. 16-18 Traineeships are a national programme which form an important part of supporting young people who have not previously obtained a Level 3 Qualification into apprenticeships, employment and further learning.
- 2. 16-18 Traineeships can include non-regulated learning but this must be a learning aim categorised as "Work Preparation-SFA traineeships" on Find a learning aim.
- 3. 16-18 Traineeships supports delivery of:
  - a. three mandatory elements to full funding for eligible Learners:
    - i. work preparation training;
    - ii. work-placement (for 16-18-year olds, the work placement must form the most substantial element of the programme); and
    - iii. English, maths or ESOL, where necessary (including having regard to the English and Maths Condition of Funding).
  - b. The «ProviderTerm» can also offer a flexible element as set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 4. Funding is for the 2022 to 2023 academic year.
- 5. The legal basis for this Service is Section 14 Education Act 2002.

## **Service Commencement and Duration**

- 6. 16-18 Traineeships (Market Entry) Services Start Date: 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022.
- 7. 16-18 Traineeships (Market Entry) Expiry Date: 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023 (for final data submission).

## Service Requirements

#### Recruitment

- 8. The «ProviderTerm» shall recruit eligible Learners onto these Services from the Services Start Date until 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023.
- 9. The recruitment will comply with the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 10. Subject to budget availability funding for Learners that were taken on or before 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023 but with a planned end date after 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023 will be made available in a subsequent agreement.

#### <u>Outputs</u>

11. The «ProviderTerm» will deliver the eligible Provision from Find a learning aim as set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules and, where appropriate, to the requirements set by the Awarding Organisations between 1<sup>st</sup> December 2022 and 31<sup>st</sup> July 2023.

- 12. All qualifications must be approved on Find a learning aim for 16-18 funding in the 2022 to 2023 Funding Year.
- 13. Ensure that the work placement, work preparation and flexible elements of the Programme take place over a period of no less than six (6) weeks and no more than twelve (12) months. The «ProviderTerm» shall assess each Learner's needs and decide what duration of Traineeship is necessary to meet them. The «ProviderTerm» shall note that the maximum of twelve (12) months is for Learners furthest away from the labour market.
- 14. The «ProviderTerm» will take steps to ensure as many Learners as possible obtain a recognised outcome as defined in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules. The Department will monitor the outcome rate.
- 15. The «ProviderTerm» will take steps to ensure they use the allocated funding in the Funding Year.
- 16. The «ProviderTerm» will maintain evidence of the delivery of the Service as set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 17. The «ProviderTerm» must provide high quality and easily accessible information and advice in helping individuals to understand the opportunities and support available to them about education, training or connected matters (including employment);
  - a. Where one of the main objectives of the Provision to be provided under this Agreement is to deliver information and advice, the «ProviderTerm» will have to have or attain the matrix Standard accreditation within the Funding Year; and
  - b. If the information and advice is embedded as part of the delivery of the Provision the «ProviderTerm» must work towards achieving the matrix Standard accreditation within the Funding Year.
  - c. Where the Provision is delivered by a Sub-Contractor on behalf of the «ProviderTerm», the requirements set out in sub-paragraphs 16.a and 16.b must be applied to the Sub-Contractor. This does not apply where the «ProviderTerm» retains responsibility for the delivery of information and advice to the Learners.
  - d. Once achieved, matrix Standard accreditation is valid for three years. The «ProviderTerm» must continue to demonstrate their continuous improvement via annual continuous improvement checks with the matrix Standard assessor.
- 18. The «ProviderTerm» will support eligible Learners as set out in the 16-19 Bursary Funding Guidance.
- 19. The «ProviderTerm» must respond to the priorities set by local commissioners and other stakeholders, for example, Local Enterprise Partnerships and their Skills Advisory Panels.

- 20. In delivering the Provision, the «ProviderTerm» will comply with the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 21. The «ProviderTerm» must deliver the Provision in England only.
- 22. The «ProviderTerm» will deliver the Service in a way that ensures:
  - a. Value for money;
  - b. The protection of public funds;
  - c. The effective delivery of a high-quality service for Learners appropriate to their needs; and
  - d. Meets the public benefit test.

#### 16-18-year old Traineeships Provision Administration

- 23. Where the Service is continued from the 2021 to 2022 Funding Year, the «ProviderTerm» must migrate data for continuing Learners from the 2021 to 2022 ILR to the 2022 to 2023 ILR. The «ProviderTerm» must submit this data in the first ILR data return for 2022 to 2023, as set out in Appendix B – Migration Specification of the ILR specification 2022 to 2023.
- 24. The «ProviderTerm» will submit Learner data to the Department to comply with Clause 21, Submission of Learner Data.
- 25. The «ProviderTerm» must complete the Learner's qualification on or before the planned end date in the data submitted in the ILR. Where the «ProviderTerm» misses this date, the Department may consider this a breach of agreement.
- 26. The «ProviderTerm» must keep the Department informed of any changes to their bank details.

#### The Department

- 27. The Department will pay for the Provision as set out in Schedule 2, 16-18year old Traineeships Payments.
- 28. The Department will monitor the 16-18-year old Traineeships Provision\_as set out in Schedule 1B, 16-18-year old Traineeships (Market Entry) Monitoring.
- 29. The Department reserves the right in its absolute discretion to reduce the Funding for the Learning Programme:
  - a. where the Department identifies that the «ProviderTerm» is failing to deliver the value of learning of this Agreement; and/or
  - b. If found to be not delivering the prior year's Service adequately when it is reported.

# SCHEDULE 1B: MONITORING

## 16-18-YEAR-OLD TRAINEESHIPS(MARKET ENTRY)

#### Monitoring of ILR Submission

- The Department will monitor and review the data submitted under Clause 21 Submission of Learner Data of this Agreement to ensure that payments are made in accordance with the requirements set out in "Financial Assurance: Monitoring the funding rules for apprenticeships and adult skills".
- 2. The Department will publish monitoring reports via <u>View your education</u> <u>data</u>. The «ProviderTerm» must access the monitoring reports every month and amend any errors for the next submission by taking the actions specified in the report user guide. Failure to amend the data as required will constitute a breach of agreement in accordance with Clause 34 (Withholding, Suspension and Repayment of Funding) of the Agreement.
- 3. If served with notice of a breach, the «ProviderTerm» must correct data or supply the Department with evidence within the period specified in the notice. This evidence can include digital copies of documents such as Learner Files, commitment statements or employer declarations. Annotated spreadsheets or notes are not acceptable as evidence.
- 4. Where data is incorrect in the final data submission of the academic year the Department will recover the payments associated with the incorrect data.

#### 16-18 Traineeships Programme Funding Performance Management

- 5. The Department will review the performance of the Services as set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules. Where the performance of the Service is below the published tolerances and thresholds, the Department will reduce the Agreement Allocation in line with the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 6. At the performance management points set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules, the Department may invite «ProviderTerm»s to submit requests for increases to its Funding. The Department will award growth in-line with the criteria set out in the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.

## 16-18 Traineeships Programme Funding Reconciliation

- 7. The Department will restrict payment under this Agreement against the Financial and Funding Years set out in Schedule 2, 16-18 Traineeship Payments.
- 8. Where the delivery within a Financial Year fails to meet the delivery profile or where the delivery within a Financial Year would result in the overall Agreement Allocation being exceeded, the Department reserves the right at its absolute discretion to vary the Agreement accordingly to balance funding

and delivery in the respective years by means of a variation (i.e. "paying for capping").

9. Reconciliation payments or recoveries may extend beyond the Agreement.

# **SCHEDULE 2: PAYMENT**

## 16-18-YEAR-OLD TRAINEESHIPS (MARKET ENTRY)

- 1. The «ProviderTerm» will submit ILR Learner Data and the Earning Adjustment Statements monthly, as set out in Clause 21 Submission of Learner Data, of the Agreement.
- 2. Using validated ILR Data, the Department will calculate the value of the «ProviderTerm»'s earnings for the Funding Year to-date by the method set out in the Funding Rates and Formula Rules. The Department will pay any unpaid earnings where the cumulative earnings do not exceed the Funding Year or Financial Year allocations, as set out in the Funding Agreement.
- 3. The Department may pay for delivery above the value of the Funding in accordance with the ESFA AEB Funding Rules.
- 4. Under Item 5A to Group 6 of Schedule 9 of the VAT Act 1994, the supply of education or vocational training funded by the Department and the supply by the person providing that education or vocational training, of any goods or services essential to that provision, is considered to be an exempt supply for VAT purposes. The Department is generally unable to recover any Value Added Tax charged. The maximum Funding payable under this Agreement, as set out in the Funding Agreement of this Schedule is inclusive of all of the costs of the Service including, but not limited to, and any other VAT or taxes to be charged, where they apply.
- 5. The Department will pay the «ProviderTerm» on the 14<sup>th</sup> Working Day of each month.
