IV. Health Information

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that:

- a) the country/ zone of origin is free from Notifiable Avian Influenza (NAI) as defined in the Terrestrial Animal Health Code of the World Organisation of Animal Health (WOAH);
- b) the bird(s) specified at part I were born and reared in a zoological garden which is under the regular surveillance of an accredited veterinarian, or originate from a premises which is under the surveillance of an accredited veterinarian;
- c) the said birds are identified by closed leg ring or ISO compatible microchip;
- d) the premises of origin and the area around it in a radius of 10 km has been free from Newcastle disease during the last 12 months and the premises of origin is not under any kind of official veterinary restrictions due to animal diseases;
- e) The premises of origin are recognised as being free from fowl typhoid (gallinarum disease) and white diarrhoea (pullorum disease) for the recent 12 months prior to export;
- f) the said birds were kept in isolation approved by the Veterinary Services since they were hatched or for the 21 days prior to shipment and showed no clinical sign of infection with a virus which would be considered NAI in poultry during the isolation period;
- g) The said birds have been serologically tested for: fowl typhoid (Salmonella enterica Gallinarum), pullorum disease (Salmonella enterica Pullorum), by agglutination test, within 14 days of exportation with negative results;
- h) The said birds have been tested for NAI by virus isolation or PCR test, the sampling was carried out on both oropharyngeal and cloacal swabs within 14 days of exportation with negative results;
- i) The said birds have not been in contact with birds which do not meet the above mentioned conditions;
- j) The said birds were examined by me within 48 hours prior to loading and were found healthy and free from any signs of contagious or infectious diseases;
- k) The said birds were containerized in new or cleaned and disinfected cages;
- l) The said birds have been examined prior to loading and have been deemed fit to travel by the chosen method. The containers are constructed in such a way that:
 - (i) is appropriate for the species, size and weight of the animals to be transported;
 - (ii) is not harmful to the health or welfare of animals;
 - (iii) has adequate strength to ensure the safety of the animals and to prevent the animals from escaping;
 - (iv) ensures the escape of animal excrements, litter, feed or feathers is prevented or minimized;
 - (v) allows observation of the animals and be marked on opposite sides with the International Air Transport Association (IATA) symbols which indicate animals and the upright position.
