Income and Expenditure

The total income of the union for the period was £512,052. This amount included payments of £503,685 in respect of membership of the union. The union's total expenditure for the period was £499,216. The union does not maintain a political fund.

Salary paid to and other benefits provided to the General Secretary and members of the Executive

The General Secretary of the union was entitled to £5,000 in respect of an honorarium. This fee has been waived in the current and preceding year. The Treasurer of the union was entitled to an honorarium of £450. No other members of the Executive were paid any amounts in respect of salary or benefits.

Irregularity statement

A member who is concerned that some irregularity may be occurring, or have occurred, in the conduct of the financial affairs of the union may take steps with a view to investigating further, obtaining clarification and, if necessary, securing regularisation of that conduct.
