PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about complaints received, which APHA received on 23 April 2022. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000.

The information you requested and the response is detailed below:

"Please provide copies of all complaints made to APHA Scotland 14 December 2021 to 31 January 2022."

Clarity was received from you on the 26 April 2022 as follows:

"please could the complaints be categorized as to which office received the complaint Ayr, Galashiels, Inverness, Inverurie, Perth"

APHA Scotland received one complaint within the time period stated. The complaint was received via the Scottish Government, no individual offices have received complaints.

The details of the complaint are being withheld citing Section 40 of the Freedom of information Act (FOIA) 2000.

Section 40

APHA does hold the information that you have requested, but have decided that the information should be withheld under sections 40(2) and 40(3A) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to persons other than you. These sections exempt personal information from disclosure if that information relates to someone other than the applicant, and if disclosure of that information would breach any of the data protection principles in Article 5(1) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

APHA is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and also works on behalf of the Scottish Government, Welsh Government and Food Standards Agency to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

APHA consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle in Article 5(1)(a) repeated in 35(1) DPA, which provides that personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly, and in a transparent manner in two ways. First, disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data, second, disclosure of that information would not be 'lawful'.

As such the complainant would hold a reasonable expectation that the complaint is for APHA's use only and not disclosed to third parties.

Under section 40 of the FOIA the term "personal data" means any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual. "Identifiable living individual" means a living individual who can be identified, directly or indirectly.

APHA have concluded that this information is exempt from disclosure under section 40 of the FOIA.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.

An Annex is attached which explains the copyright that applies to the information being released to you and contact details should you be unhappy with the service you have received.
