

Animals moved into England and Wales: Application for Cattle Passports

The Cattle Identification Regulations 2007 (as amended)

Important Information

Use this form to apply for cattle passports for animals moved into England and Wales from a European Union (EU) country, or from outside the EU. This form must be completed and signed by the keeper in respect of all animals moved into England and Wales from a European Union (EU) country, or from outside the EU. However, if cattle are moved into England and Wales for direct slaughter it is not necessary to apply for cattle passports provided the animals are slaughtered at a slaughterhouse within 15 days.

Animals imported into England and Wales from a non-EU country must be retagged with an official UK ear tag as required by the Cattle Identification Regulations 2007 (as amended) within 20 days, and a passport applied for within 15 days of re-tagging.

It is an offence under the Cattle Identification Regulations 2007 (as amended) to move an animal that has moved into England and Wales unless it is accompanied by a properly completed passport issued by the BCMS. This does NOT include the journey from the border inspection post to the holding of destination.

If animals are imported into England and Wales from an EU country, or moved into England and Wales from the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Northern Ireland, the keeper must, within 15 days of their arrival at the holding of destination:

- register them with the Secretary of State, and
- surrender their cattle passports (if any) to them.

These provisions apply once the animals reach a holding that is not a market or showground, if this is their initial destination.

All cattle moved into England and Wales after 1 July 1996 have to be registered with the British Cattle Movement Service.

Animals imported into England and Wales from an EU country and identified according to European rules do not need to be retagged unless the tag is illegible or lost, in which case they must be retagged with replacement tags bearing the original number. Their cattle passports must be applied for within 15 days of arriving at the holding of destination.

Your application will not be acknowledged. If you have not received your Cattle Passports or heard from BCMS within 15 days, please contact the BCMS on 0345 050 1234 or 0345 050 3456 if you are a cattle keeper in Wales.

Completed forms must be returned to BCMS, Curwen Road, Workington, Cumbria CA14 2DD. You must include:

- A list of the animal details; and
- A copy of the export Health Certificate(s) (please do not send originals) and
- For EU animals, the original foreign passport or passport details sheet in the case of animals from Northern Ireland (please do not send photocopies).

It is your responsibility to ensure all supporting documents are supplied and correspond. Failure to supply any of the above documents will result in a delay in your application.
