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1. Introduction

This document records the representations Natural England has received on the proposals for Variation Report 10 from persons or bodies. It also sets out any Natural England comments on these representations.

2. Background

Natural England's report setting out its proposal to vary the route at Esk Boathouse, within the approved part 1 of the Gretna to Allonby stretch, was submitted to the Secretary of State on 9 May 2022. This began an eight-week period during which representations and objections could be made.

In total, Natural England received two representations pertaining to VR10, both of which were made by organisations or individuals whose representations must be sent in full to the Secretary of State in accordance with paragraph 8(1)(a) of Schedule 1A to the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949. These 'full' representations are reproduced in Section 3 in their entirety, together with Natural England's comments.

The Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) Regulations 2016 require a permit or exemption to be obtained for any activities which will take place:

- on or within 8 metres of a main river (16 metres if tidal)
- on or within 8 metres of a flood defence structure or culverted main river (16 metres if tidal)
- on or within 16 metres of a sea defence
- involving quarrying or excavation within 16 metres of any main river, flood defence (Including a remote defence) or culvert
- in a floodplain more than 8 metres from the river bank, culvert or flood defence structure (16 metres if tidal) and you don't already have planning permission. For further
