Part II. Certification

I, the undersigned official veterinarian, declare that I have read and understood Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009 and in particular Article 10 thereof, and Commission Regulation (EU) No 142/2011, and in particular Annex XIV, Chapter II thereof, and certify that the hides and skins described above:

II.1 have been obtained from animals that:

⁽¹⁾either [- were slaughtered and their carcasses are fit for human consumption in accordance with retained EU law;]

⁽¹⁾or [- were slaughtered in a slaughterhouse, after undergoing ante-mortem inspection, and were considered fit, as a result of such inspection, for slaughter for human consumption in accordance with retained EU law;]

⁽¹⁾or [- did not show any clinical signs of any disease communicable to humans or animals through the hide or skin, and were not killed to eradicate any epizootic disease;]

Commission Regulation(EU) No 206/2010, from which imports of fresh meat of the corresponding species are authorised and have been:

- (1) *either* [dried;]
- (1) *or* [dry-salted or wet-salted for at least 14 days prior to dispatch;]
- (1) *or* [dry-salted or wet-salted on the following date and according to the declaration of the transporter, the hides and skins will be transported by ship and the duration of transport will be such that they will have undergone a minimum of 14 days of salting before they reach the border control post of the point of entry into Great Britain;]
- (1) *or* [salted for seven days in sea salt with the addition of 2% of sodium carbonate;]
- (1) *or* [salted in sea salt with the addition of 2 % of sodium carbonate on the following date and according to the declaration of the transporter, the hides and skins will be transported by ship and the duration of transport will be such that they will have undergone a minimum of seven days of salting before they reach the border control post of the point of entry into Great Britain.]]

(1)(2) *or* **II.2** come from animals which originate from a third country or, in the case of regionalisation in accordance with retained EU law, from a part of a third country, listed in a document relating to ‘fresh meat of ungulates’ published on gov.uk, in accordance with Regulation (EU) No 206/2010, from which imports of fresh meat of the corresponding species are NOT authorised and have been:

- (1) *either* [salted for seven days in sea salt with the addition of 2% of sodium carbonate;]
- (1) *or* [salted in sea salt with the addition of 2 % of sodium carbonate on the following date and according to the declaration of the transporter, the hides and skins will be transported by ship and the duration of transport will be such that they will have undergone a minimum of seven days of salting before they reach the border control post of the point of entry into Great Britain;]
- (1) *or* [dried for 42 days at a temperature of at least 20°C;]]

II.3 the consignment has not been in contact with other animal products or with live animals presenting a risk of spreading a serious transmissible disease.

Notes

References to European Union legislation within this certificate are references to direct EU legislation which has been retained in Great Britain (retained EU law as defined in the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018) and can be viewed on the UK legislation website (legislation.gov.uk).

References to Great Britain in this certificate include Channel Islands and Isle of Man.

Part I:

Box reference I.6: Person responsible for the consignment in Great Britain: this box is to be filled in only if it is a certificate for transit commodity; it may be filled in if the certificate is for import commodity.

Box reference I.11 and I.12: Approval number: the registration number of the establishment or plant, which has been issued by the competent authority.

- Box reference I.19: Use the appropriate HS code: 41.01; 41.02 or 41.03.

- Box reference I.25: Technical use: any use other than for animal consumption.
- Box reference I.26 and I.27: Fill in according to whether it is a transit or an import certificate.
