HORNSEA ONE OFFSHORE WINDFARM ORDER 2014, SCHEDULE 11, DEEMED MARINE LICENCE 4 - VARIATION 4

In December 2014 the Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change granted consent for the Hornsea One Offshore Wind Farm Order (“the Order”) which included, in Schedules 8-11, 4 Deemed Marine Licences (“DMLs”) in accordance with Section 149 of the Planning Act 2008.

On 28 July 2022 the Marine Management Organisation (“MMO”) received a request from Ørsted to vary DML 4, contained within Schedule 11 of the Order. The request was to make the following change:

- The licence holder name contained within Schedule 11 to be changed from “Hornsea 1 Limited” to “Diamond Transmission Partners Hornsea One Limited”.

This variation is to reflect the transfer of DML 4 to an Offshore Transmission Owner (“OFTO”) which took place in 2021. The Transfer of Benefit Agreement together with a notice to the Secretary of State for the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (“BEIS”) were submitted on the 08 March 2021 with the divestment of the OFTO assets being completed on 12 March 2021.

The MMO has now completed its consideration of this variation request and, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3) (d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, has varied DML 4 as detailed in the Notice of Variation enclosed.

Also enclosed is a copy of the varied DML.


