

The Environment Agency is proposing to revoke (cancel) the abstraction licence numbers mentioned below.

The Environment Agency is required to give notice of this proposal. The Environment Agency give this notice under section 52 of the Water Resources Act 1991 and regulation 31 of the Water Resources (Abstraction and Impounding) Regulations 2006.

The Environment Agency has made this proposal as part of a programme to achieve sustainable abstraction and to conserve, and secure the proper use of, water resources.

Details of the proposal

Licence number 1/25/03/020, allows the licence holder Aycliffe Angling Club, C/O John Robert Todd (Match Secretary), 2 Jackson Place, Newton Aycliffe, Durham, DL5 5BW to abstract a total of 32,000 cubic metres (m³) a year at National Grid Reference (NGR) NZ 262 244. The licence holder can abstract water for lake and pond throughflow, all year.

Licence number 1/21/00/023, allows the licence holder Stephen Cockcroft and Richard Cockcroft trading as Bowsden Hall Farm, Bowsden Hall Farm, Bowsden, Berwick-Upon-Tweed, Northumberland, TD15 2NR to abstract a total of 8,711 m³ a year, at National Grid Reference (NGR) NT 94339 44006. The licence holder can abstract water for domestic and agricultural use (other than spray irrigation), all year.

The proposal is to revoke (cancel) the licences listed above.
