RE: Request for Information - RFI4101

Thank you for your request for information which was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You requested the following information:

The Washington Development Corporation was dissolved on 30th. June 1988. I understand from the National Archives, Kew, that you my hold the records thereof. I urgently need to know of any information you may hold on the above. In 1970 Washington Development Corporation {WDC} compulsory purchased the Oxclose Waggonway [OWW] [No. 1 of 1970]. It was ratified by General Vesting Declaration [GVD] of 15/5/1972. The GVD is referred to in the conveyance of land adjoining the OWW from WDC to George Wimpey dated 5/4/1973., registered at HMLR under title number DU40363. There is no record available at HMLR of the GVD registration.

I should be most grateful if you could supply me with a copy of the GVD registration and accompanying plan, and details of what happened to the OWW on dissolution of WDC.

Response


We can confirm that Homes England does not hold the information detailed in your request.



You may also complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) however, the Information Commissioner does usually expect the internal review procedure to be exhausted in the first instance.
