I strongly object to the above proposal of a further 200 houses in Elsenham. The impact on local residents will be enormous.

Elsenham and Henham are 2 separate villages, but with continued development, (Bloor Homes are already building 350 homes in this area), I can see a time in the not to distant future when they become 1.

This is a rural area and It seems as if we are constantly being drip fed developments which are not sustainable as there is no infrastructure to support them. The local school and doctors surgery are both full. There is only one very small supermarket in the area. Residents have to drive to Bishop Stortford for larger shopping facilities.

We already struggle with too much traffic on our small roads, with routes through to Stansted already difficult with frequent jams in Grove Hill and Chapel Hill and narrow lanes through Ugley.

If the Secretary of State in 2016 said that 800 houses in Elsenham and Henham was unsustainable and refused permission, how can 1000 houses in smaller developments which are either already built or in the process of being built or proposed for this area be sustainable either.

I bought a home here because it was a small, rural, village. We are now in danger of losing both reasons. Loss of prime agricultural land in today's world is a travesty.
