The secretary of state considered a proposal for 800 dwellings on land included in the current allication was not sustainable in 2016 and therefore **REFUSED** planning permission.

Howcome it is possible that if 800 dwellings are not sustainable, but by piecmeal developments already approved or applied for of potentially 1,000 dwellings are ?

I believe that this planning application is totally unsuitable for this location where the current inhabitants are plagued by vastly inadequate and totally congested traffic problems extending to Stansted Mountfichet and beyond.
