

- whether (you) the contract holder engaged in, or threatened to engage in or allowed, incited or encouraged any person living or visiting to engage in:
 - a) conduct capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to a person with a right to live in the premises or in accommodation in the locality.
 - b) conduct capable of causing a nuisance or annoyance to a person engaged in lawful activity in the dwelling or the locality of that dwelling.
 - c) conduct capable of causing nuisance or annoyance to the landlord or a person acting in connection with the landlord's housing management functions.
- whether (you) the contract holder used or threatened to use or allowed incited or encouraged any person to use the dwelling, common parts and any other part of the dwelling for criminal purposes.
- · whether it is reasonable to make the order.
