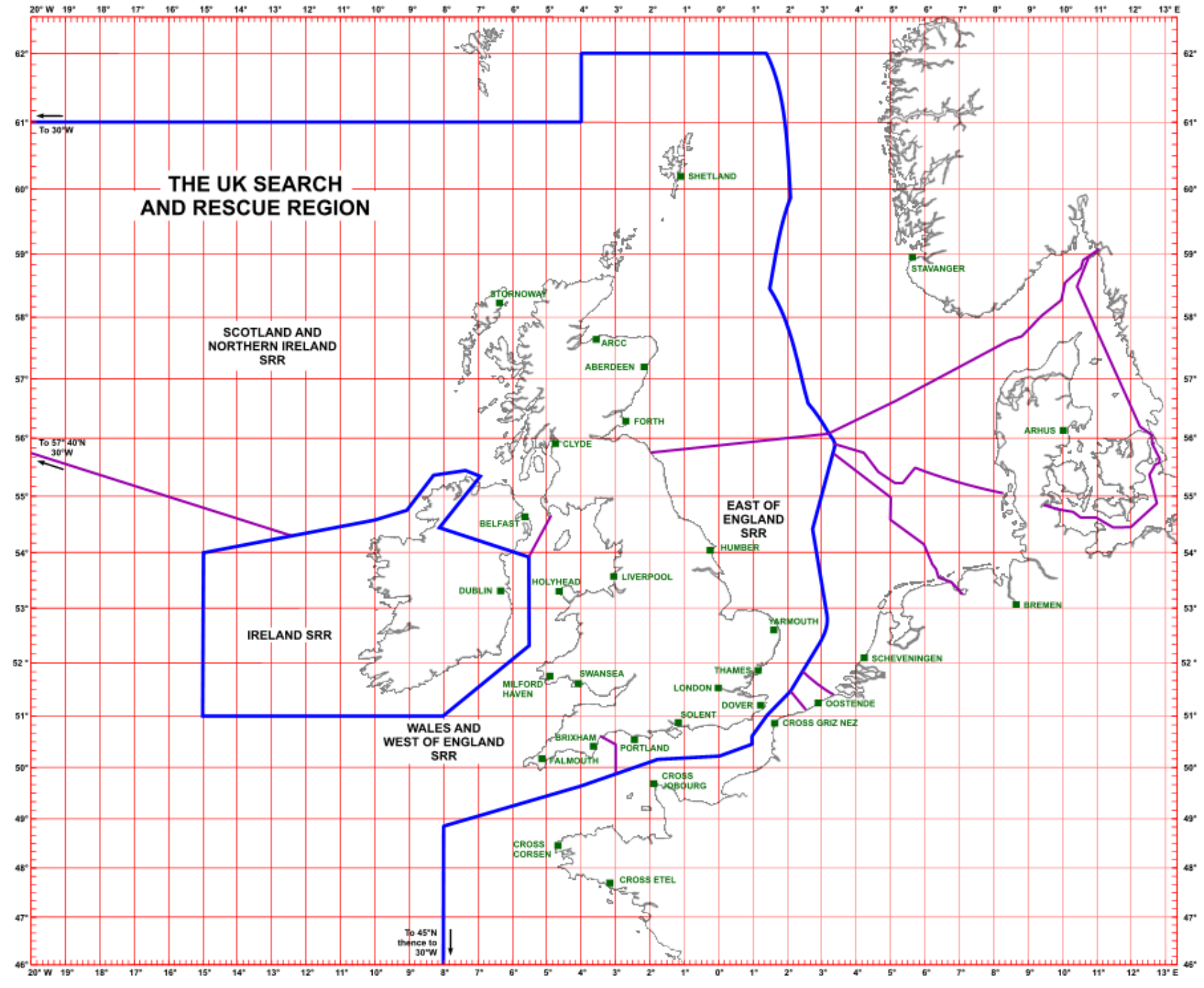

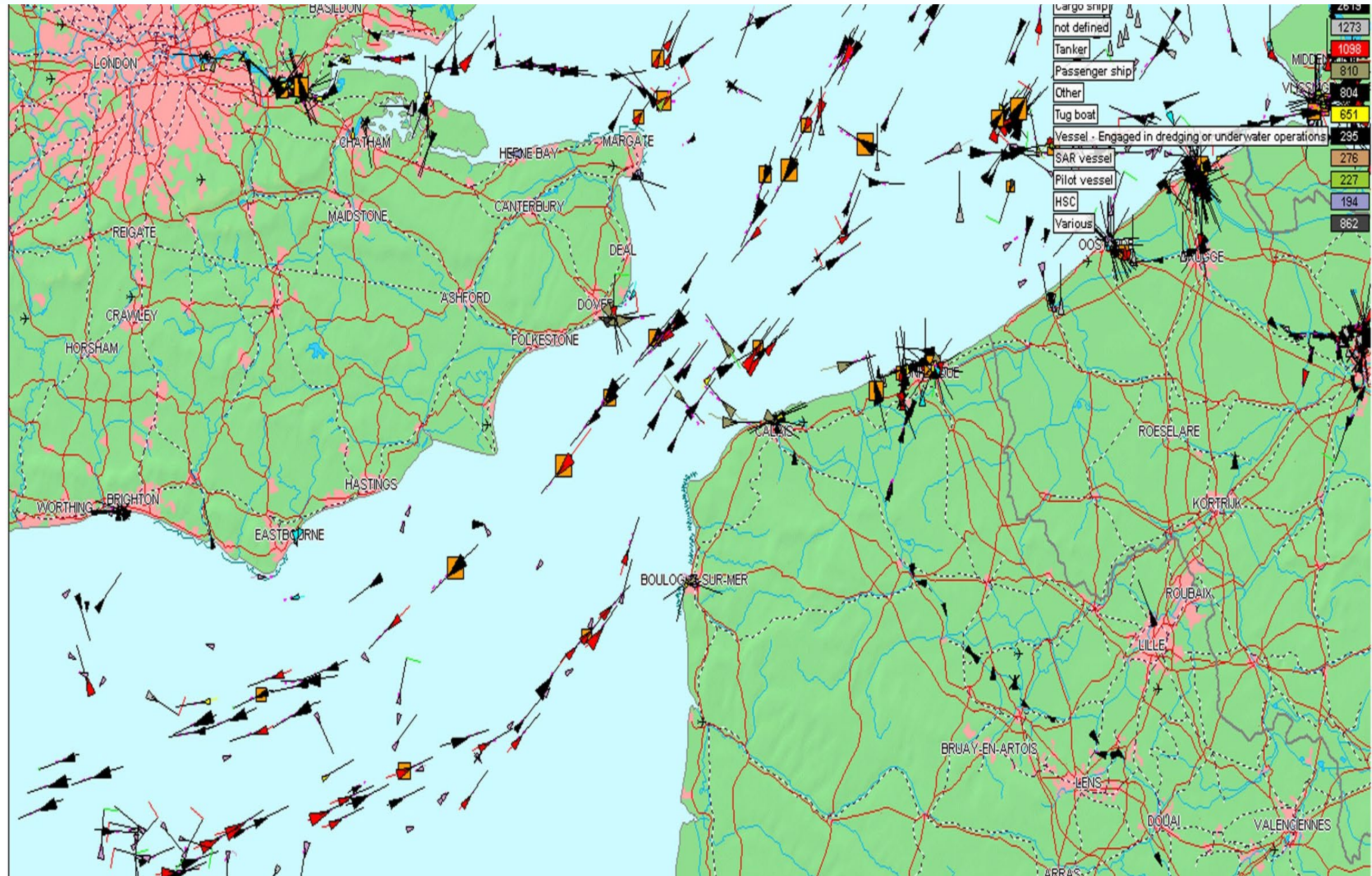

# Medical Regulations for commercial vessels

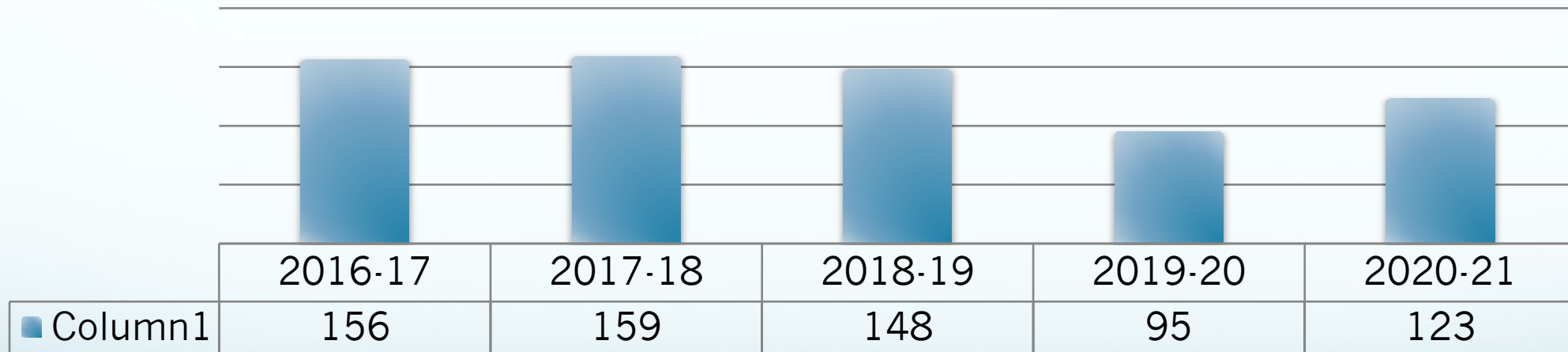
- Cat A- worldwide
  - Full medical kit (IMO specification), Ship's captain medical guide, Master-advanced first aid course.
- Cat B- to 150nm
  - Medical kit (IMO specification), Ship's captain Medical guide
- Cat C – harbours, local trips, no overnight accommodation
  - First aid kit, St John's/Red cross first aid book

# Employed vs passengers

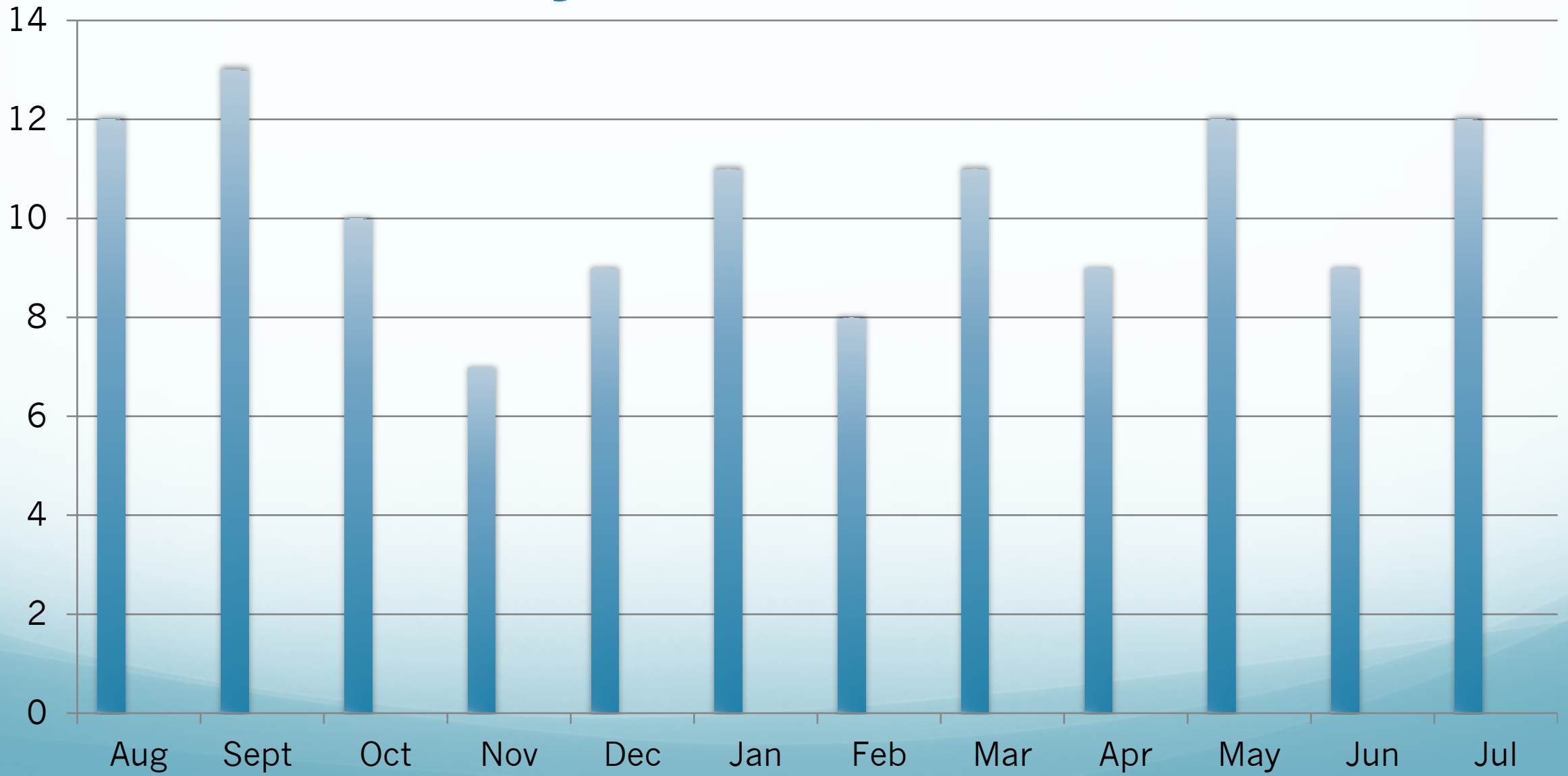
- Employed seafarers – must have an ENG 1 to work at sea.
- Ship's carry > 100 people, Doctor on board. With full medical kit
  - Exceptions- ferries within coastal waters
  - Military
  - Scientific
- Ship's carrying >12 passengers must carry a Doctor's bag



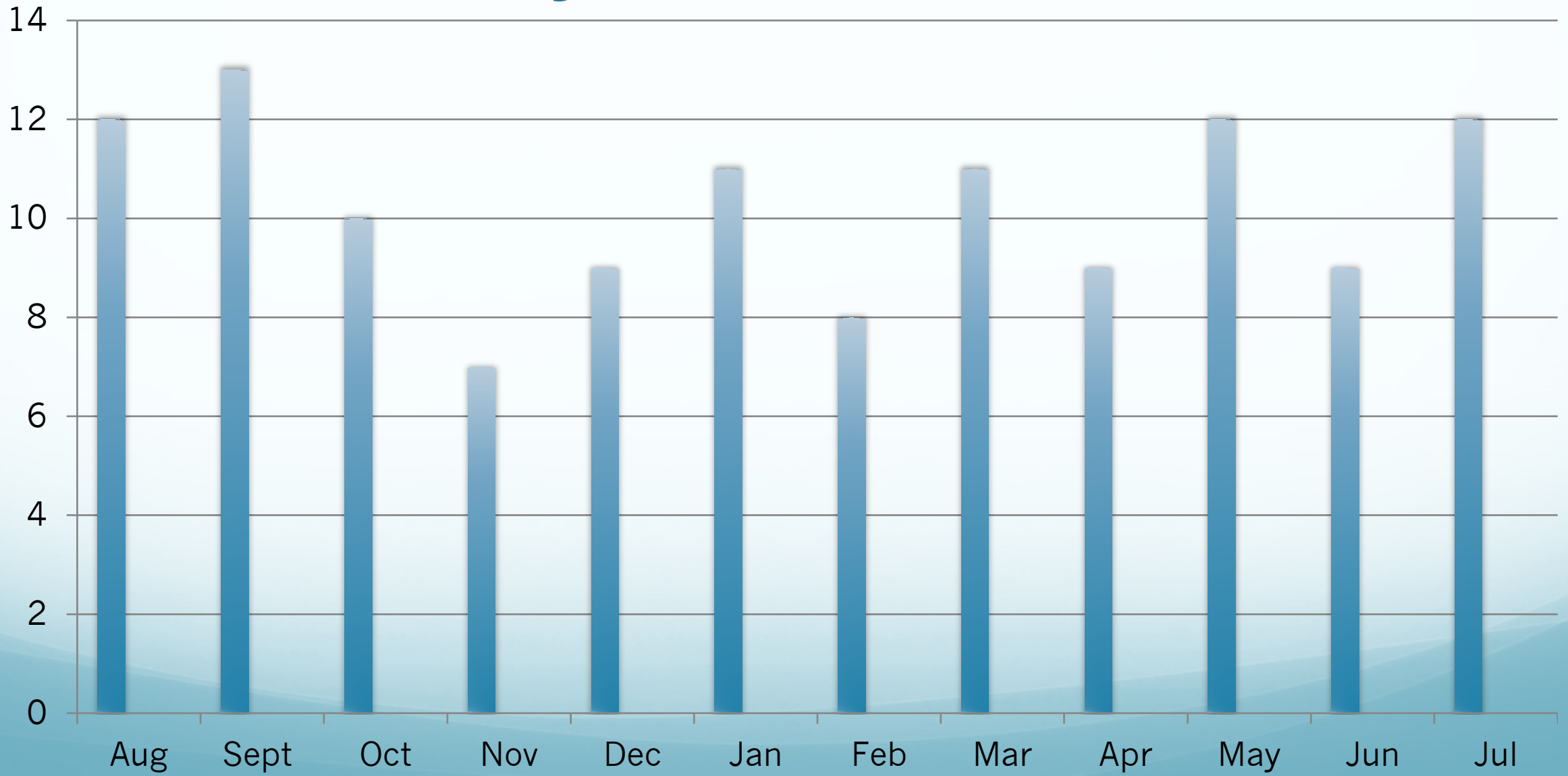
# TMAS Total No. of calls



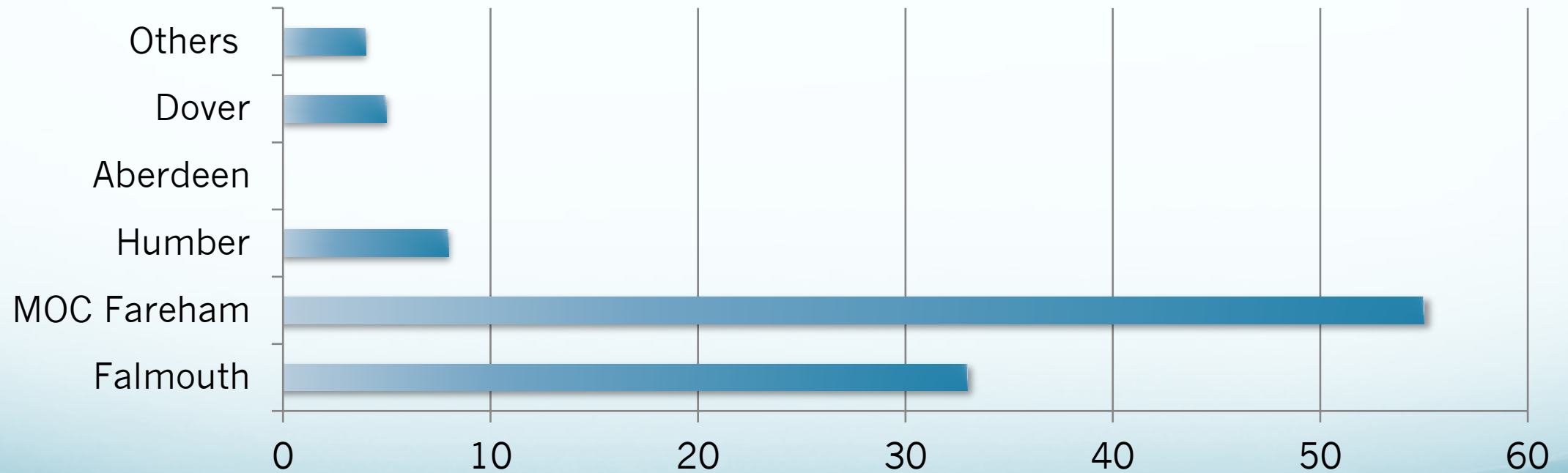
# Monthly Call Distribution



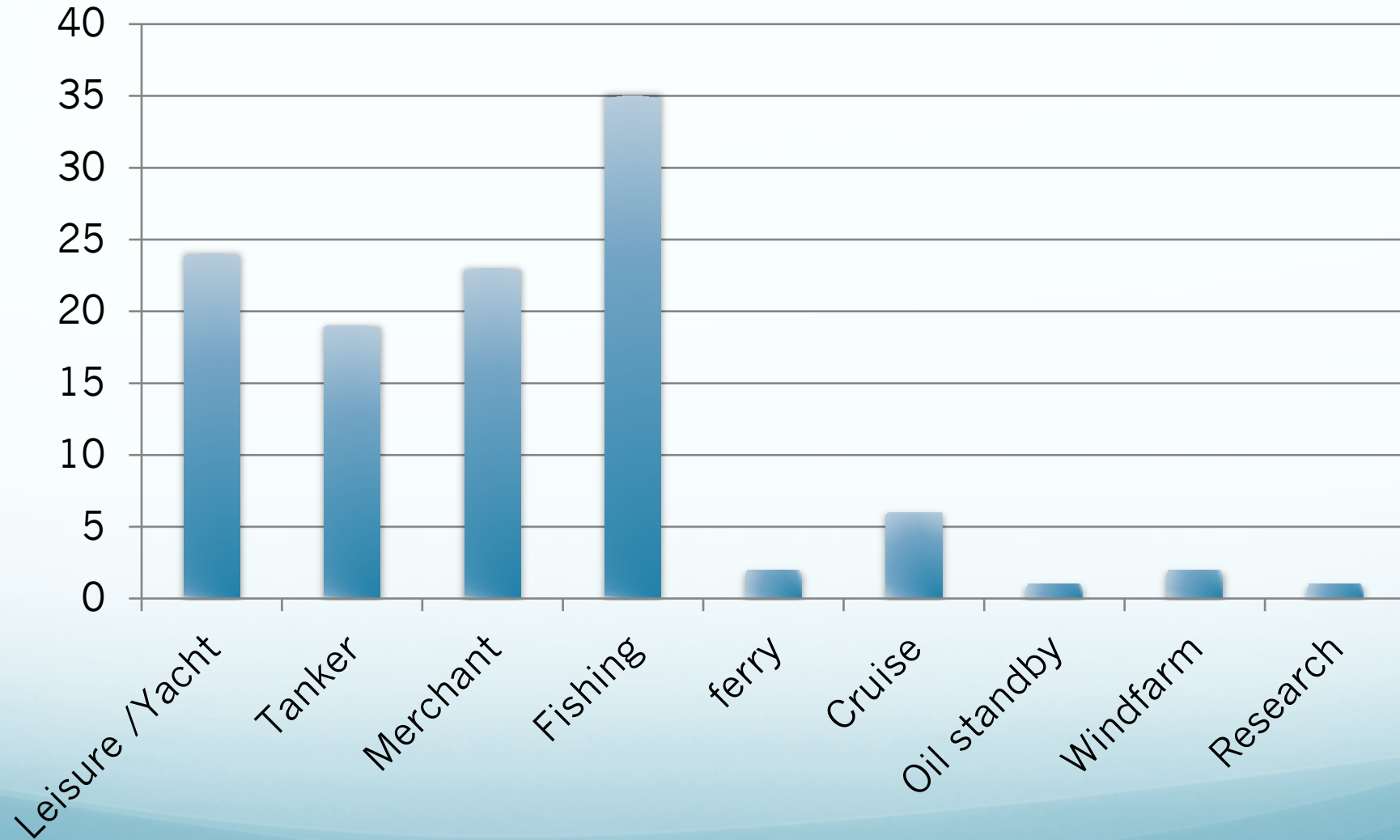

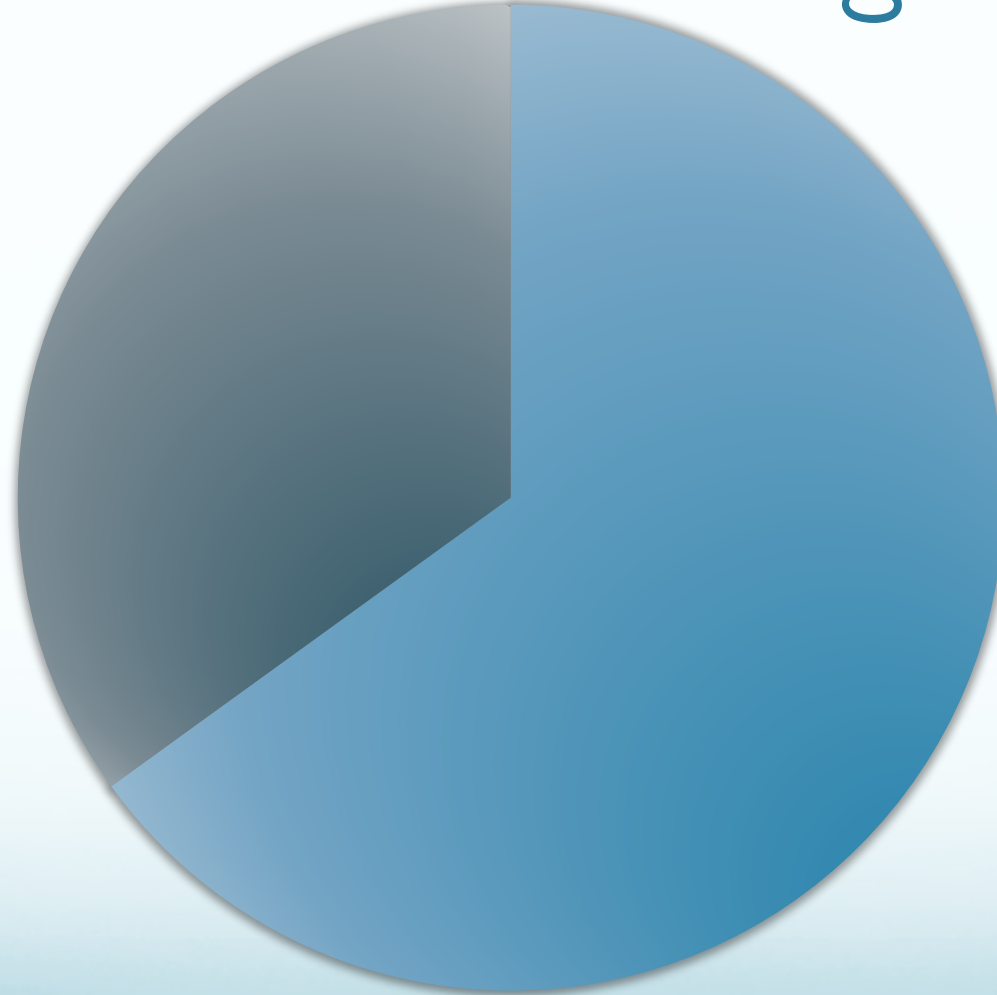
# Originating Coastguard Station

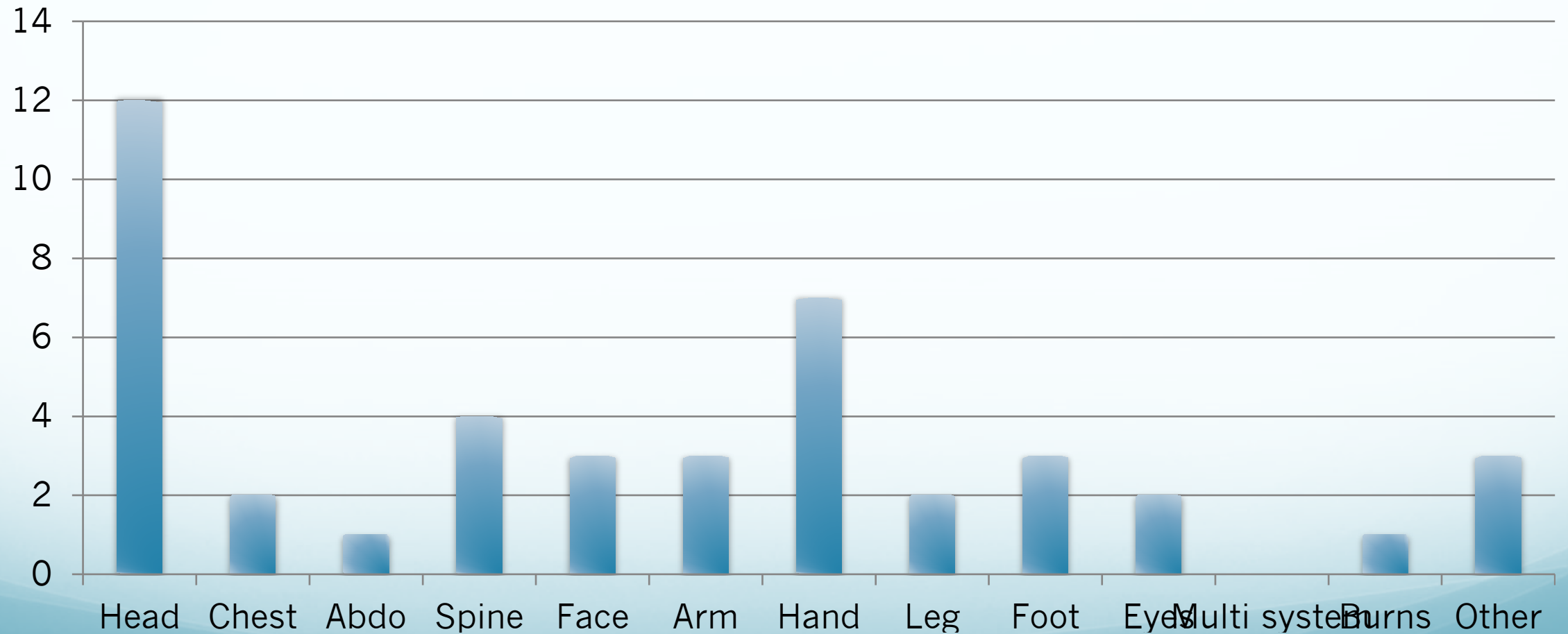

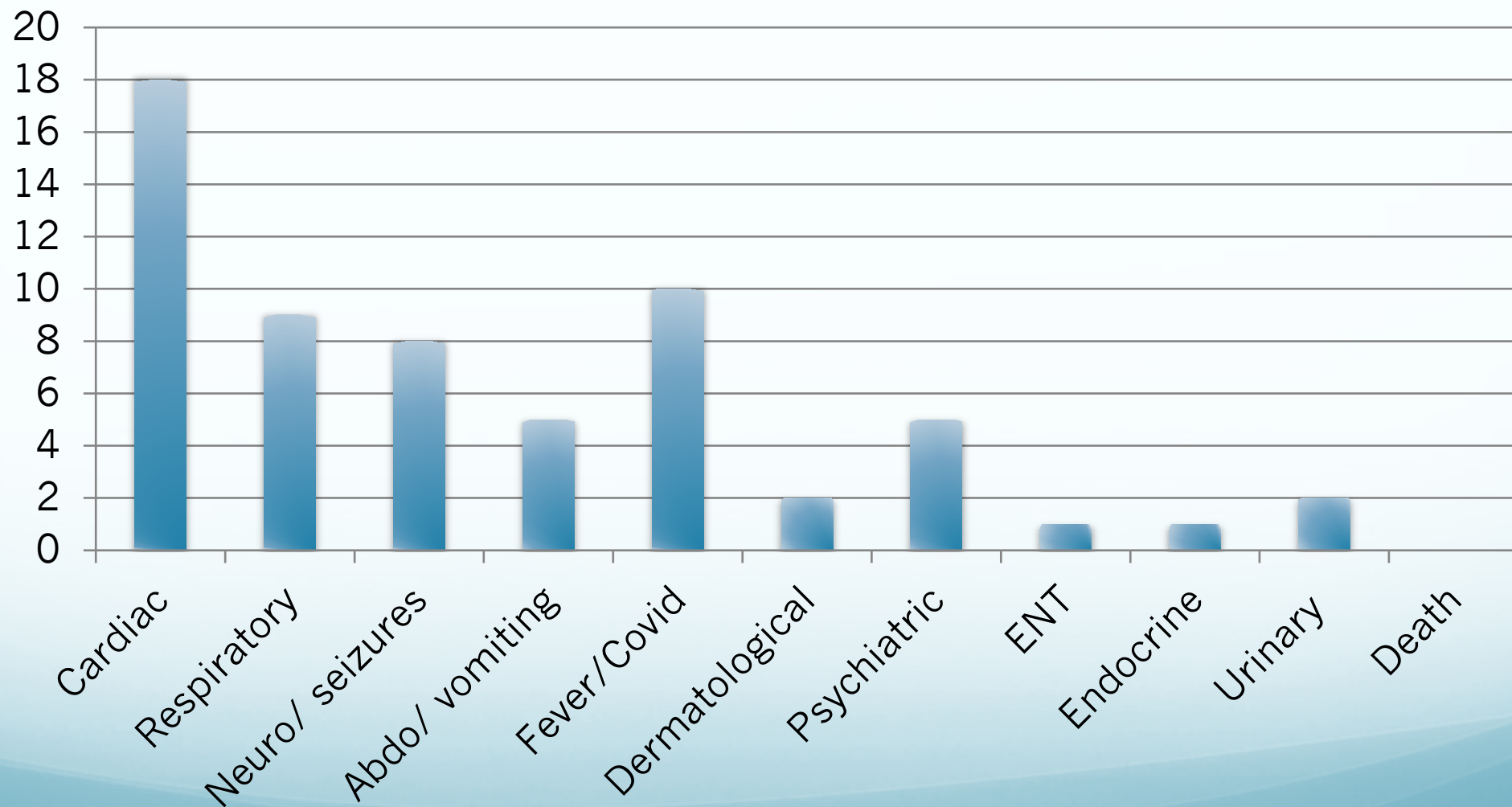

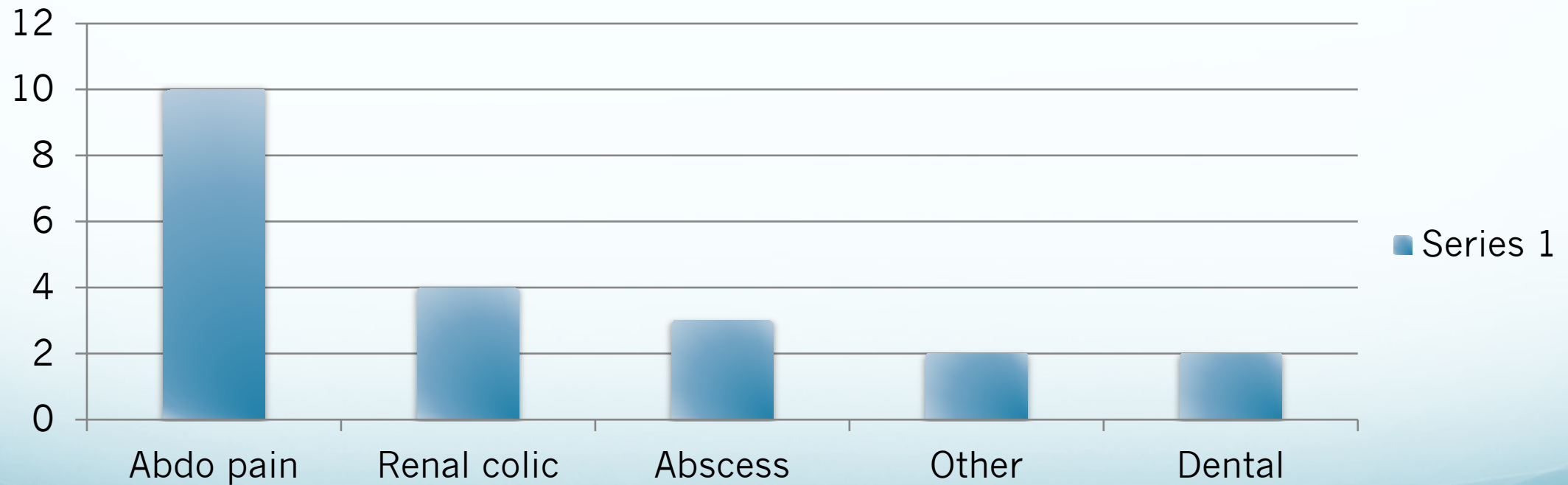




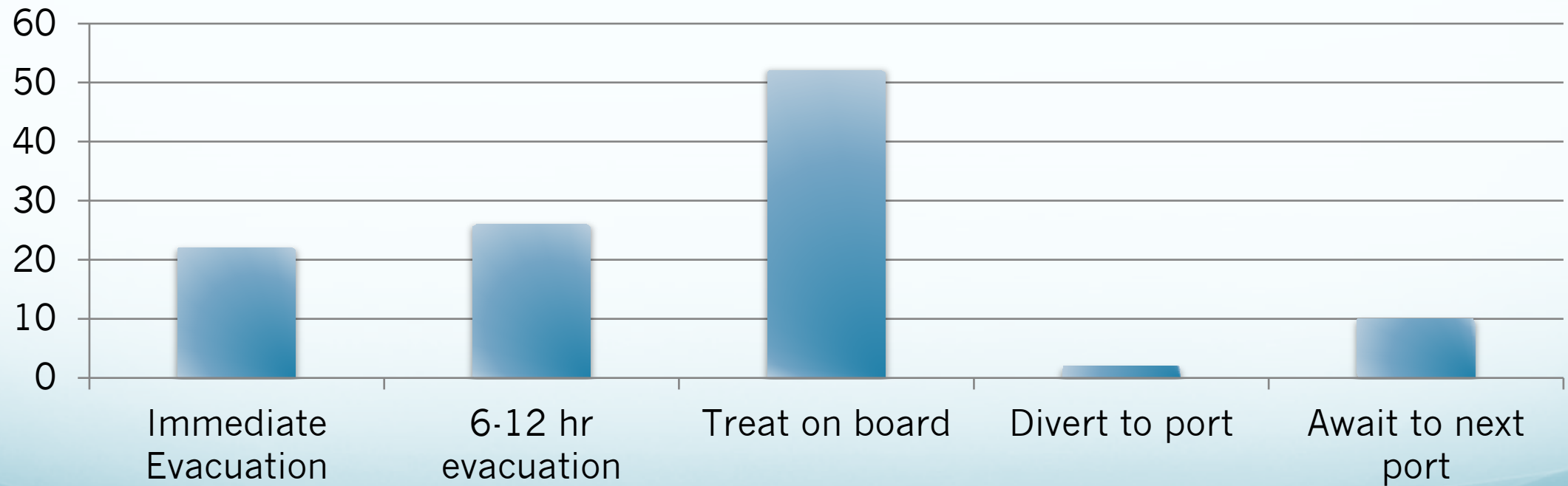
# Medical breakdown
