PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about APHA transparency, which APHA received on 17 August 2022. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000.

The information you requested and the response is detailed below:

"Can you please tell me the following?

"(1) When was your organisation's framework agreement last reviewed or updated?"

The APHA Framework was published in 2014. It was reviewed the first part of 2022 and is awaiting sign off and the revised framework is due to be published in October 2022.

"(2) Do you carry out impact assessments before introducing a new policy or regulation?"

APHA is a delivery body for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), Scottish and Welsh governments and does not draft or introduce policy – but it delivers the policy of the three administrations. APHA is a Regulator and abides by the Regulators Code.

"(3) Do you keep a register of interests for board members or senior figures, and if so, can you please supply me with a copy of the latest version?"

APHA does keep a specific register of interests for Board members as these are recorded in the minutes of each board meeting rather than a separate register. Members are asked to update and inform the board at each meeting of any new or amendments to declarations of interest. APHA do not hold a specific register therefore this information is not held.

APHA is an Executive Agency of the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and also works on behalf of the Scottish Government, Welsh Government and Food Standards Agency to safeguard animal and plant health for the benefit of people, the environment and the economy.

"(4) Do you keep a register of hospitality/gifts received by board members or senior figures, and if so, can you also supply me with data for the last three years?"

APHA has a hospitality and gifts register and this is held centrally by the Agency for all staff. This should be requested from the APHA Risk and Assurance Manager, who is part of the APHA Finance Team and the email address is: <u>APHAAuditandGovernance@apha.gov.uk</u>
