JUDGMENT

- 1. The claimant's claim for discrimination under s15 of the Equality Act 2022 and s20/21 in relation to the decision on 14 April 2021 to require her to relinquish her bank manager role and her further claim that the respondent failed to make a reasonable adjustment to its practice requiring a role to be relinquished for an employee to become entitled to disability insurance benefits, was not submitted within 3 months starting with the date of the alleged act of discrimination. However it was submitted within a further period that I find to be just and equitable in accordance with s123(1)(b) of the Equality Act 2010 so the tribunal has jurisdiction to consider these claims.
- 2. The claimant has also brought further claims that the respondent had failed in its duty to make reasonable adjustments, contrary to s20 and 21 of the Equality Act which were not submitted within 3 months starting with the date of the alleged act of discrimination. Whether the employment tribunal has jurisdiction to consider those claims will be determined at the final hearing.
