Dear ,

Thank you for your email of 23 June clarifying your request for the following information:

The age, date, and location of death of 53 UK soldiers who were killed outside of Northern Ireland by the IRA.

Please can you also specify how many of these UK soldiers were killed post 1984. Furthermore, can you provide the full name of these soldiers and their rank within the British Army. How they were killed by the IRA, i.e. shot, stabbed, etc.

## Clarifying that:

My foi request refers to those just in the army.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held. Please note, the number of deaths quoted in your original request (53) were not all UK Army personnel therefore the number of deaths in the attached information at Annex A is lower. All of the Army personnel deaths listed have been attributed to the Troubles in Northern Ireland, however information on which faction, including the IRA, was responsible is not held.

If you have any queries regarding the content of this letter, please contact this office in the first instance. ## Annex A: British Army deaths outside of Northern Ireland as a result of the Troubles.

## Notes:

- Defence Statistics Health compiles the Department's authoritative deaths database for all UK Armed Forces personnel who died whilst in Service going back to 1984. Information is compiled from several internal and external sources from which we release several internal analyses and external National Statistics Notices.
- 2. For data prior to 1984, Defence Statistics have access to the Armed Forces Memorial (AFM) database owned by the tri-Service Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre. The AFM database was created in order to identify Service personnel whose names were and continue to be engraved on the Armed Forces Memorial at the National Arboretum in Staffordshire. The AFM database records the deaths of all personnel who have died in Service since 1 January 1948, and for those who were killed or who died in Palestine from 1 August 1945 to 31 August 1948. Please note, the AFM database is not regarded as a validated source of historical fatality information, therefore, it cannot be guaranteed to be 100% complete or accurate due to it being populated manually from Service files.
