Subject: Freedom of Information request (RFI 058) – Quarterly qualifying defence contract statistics Q3 2021/22 – underlying data

You wrote to us on 30 March 2022 requesting a range of information pertaining to contracts referred to in our quarterly statistical bulletin published in February 2022. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

To date we have provided you with the requested information for 123 contracts, provided some of the requested information for a further 177 contracts and confirmed that all the requested information for a further 8 contracts is exempt from disclosure under the FOI Act. Since our last letter on 17 November we have continued to consider information provided by external parties for the purpose of determining whether any exemption from disclosure should apply to the remaining information referred to in your request.

We are now able to confirm that we hold information for a further 13 contracts covered by your request. We have provided as an appendix to this letter a table providing all or some of the requested information for these contracts.

- In 4 cases we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 41 of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that the information was provided in confidence. The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. This is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.
- In 12 cases we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 43(2) of the FOI Act. This exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Secretary of State for Defence and/or the defence contractors concerned. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, where disclosure would make it less likely that defence contractors would provide the MOD with information in the future, or where disclosure would make it more difficult for the MOD or defence contractors to be able to conduct commercial transactions or have future dealings with each other without fear of suffering commercially as a result, these are factors that weigh in favour of maintaining the exemption. Having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against this risk, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Please note that two of the data sources you requested are either not always used in preparing our bulletin (Date contract entered into – regulation 22(2)(h)) or are not used in preparing our bulletin (Total contract price – regulation 22(2)(k)). The methodology in the [bulletin](#) indicates the data sources that we used.

The contract price information that underpins the analysis presented in the SSRO's statistical bulletins is information to which Schedule 5 of the Defence Reform Act 2014 applies. Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 prohibits disclosure of the information, except in circumstances specified in paragraphs 3 to 5 of that schedule. We consider that none of the exceptions apply to your request. As such, section 44(1)(a) of the FOI Act would apply to a request for that information, which is an absolute exemption and not subject to a public interest test.

In some cases, the Total contract price information held by us and disclosed is zero. This may be because the information was not reported to us or because the contract is a framework contract in respect of which no contract price was agreed at the time the contract was entered into.

Review of progress of your request to date

Having worked on responding to your request for several months, we have now reviewed the progress we have made and the resources expended to date in responding. We have also considered the resources we expect will be needed to conclude dealing with your request.

We estimate that the handling of your request has taken at least 36 person days to date. This includes time taken communicating with the parties to the contracts covered by your information request; considering information supplied by those parties to enable us to determine whether any exemptions should apply to the information requested and (where required) whether the public interest favours disclosure; internal governance; maintaining records to assist in the administration of our response to your request; and preparing and checking the information for release.

Including the disclosure provided today, we have:

- provided a full or partial response in respect of 76 per cent of the contracts covered by your request; and
- determined to disclose or exempt from disclosure 70 per cent of the 3,400 items of information covered by your request.

Of the 2,391 items of information we have determined to disclose or exempt to date, 11 per cent have been found to be exempt from disclosure. Exempt information has been found in 37 per cent of the contracts in respect of which a response has been made.

In the light of our experience of processing your request, we consider we would need to spend at least a further 15.5 person days to fulfil your request for the remaining 30 per cent of the items of information covered.

Refusal to proceed further with your request

Following our review of the resources needed to comply with your request and considering again the requirements of the FOI Act, we have now determined that the time required to respond to your request is unduly burdensome on our organisation's limited resources. Section 14(1) of the FOI Act provides that a public authority is not obliged to comply with a request for information if the request is vexatious. The Information Commissioner's Office has provided [guidance](#) which indicates that a request may be considered vexatious where the need to review and prepare information for disclosure in response to the request would place a grossly oppressive burden on the organisation. Having considered the public interest in openness and transparency about qualifying contracts, we have determined that the case for invoking section 14(1) of the FOI Act is made out. We will, therefore, undertake no further work in respect of this request.

Advice

Without knowing the purpose for which you requested the information about qualifying contracts it is difficult for us to provide specific advice on the formulation of a less burdensome information request about qualifying contracts. Should you wish to submit an alternative information request you might consider limiting your request in a variety of ways, for example:

- seeking a more limited set of information about contracts;
- seeking only information about contracts held by a single or small group of contractors;
- seeking only information about contracts agreed during a specified time period;
- seeking only information about contracts whose price is above or below a certain amount – or about contracts which together account for a specified proportion of the total price for all contracts.

The parameters that you set around any further request will determine the number of contracts to which the request relates and, accordingly, the work required by us to engage with relevant third parties and consider whether the FOI Act requires disclosure or exemption from disclosure.

It remains the case that a more limited information request might also be subject to exemptions from disclosure under the FOI Act.

Review

Except for matters already covered by the internal review requested on 29 July (the outcome of which was reported to you on 19 August), you have the right to ask for an internal review if you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be addressed to: enquiries@ssro.gov.uk.

Subject: Freedom of Information request (RFI 058) – Quarterly qualifying defence contract statistics Q3 2021/22 – underlying data

You wrote to us on 30 March 2022 requesting a range of information pertaining to contracts referred to in our quarterly statistical bulletin published in February 2022. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

To date we have provided you with the requested information for 122 contracts, provided some of the requested information for a further 141 contracts and confirmed that all the requested information for a further 8 contracts is exempt from disclosure under the FOI Act. Since our last letter on 20 October we have continued to engage with external parties for the purpose of determining whether any exemption from disclosure should apply to the remaining information referred to in your request.

We are now able to confirm that we hold information for a further 37 contracts covered by your request. We have provided at Appendix 1 to this letter a table providing all or some of the requested information for these contracts.

- In three cases we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 43(2) of the FOI Act. This exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Secretary of State for Defence and/or the defence contractors concerned. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, where disclosure would make it less likely that defence contractors would provide the MOD with information in the future, or where disclosure would make it more difficult for the MOD or defence contractors to be able to conduct commercial transactions or have future dealings with each other without fear of suffering commercially as a result, these are factors that weigh in favour of maintaining the exemption. Having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against this risk, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
- In one case we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 41 of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that the information was provided in confidence. The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. This is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.

For 44 contracts in respect of which a partial disclosure of information was first made on 24 August and 4 contracts in respect of which a partial disclosure of information was first made on 20 October we have given further consideration to the disclosure of information not previously disclosed or exempted from disclosure. We have provided at Appendix 2 to this letter an updated disclosure for these 48 contracts.

- In 71 cases we have determined that the items of information requested are exempt from disclosure under section 43(2) of the FOI Act. This exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Secretary of State for Defence and/or the defence contractors concerned. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, where disclosure would make it less likely that defence contractors would provide the MOD with information in the future, or where disclosure would make it more difficult for the MOD or defence contractors to be able to conduct commercial transactions or have future dealings with each other without fear of suffering commercially as a result, these are factors that weigh in favour of maintaining the exemption. Having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against this risk, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
- In 9 cases we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 41 of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that the information was provided in confidence. The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. This is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.
- In 1 case we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 26(1)(a) of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the defence of the British Islands or of any colony. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against the risks that disclosure would be likely to prejudice the UK's defence policies, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Please note that two of the data sources you requested are either not always used in preparing our bulletin (Date contract entered into – regulation 22(2)(h)) or are not used in preparing our bulletin (Total contract price – regulation 22(2)(k)). The methodology in the [bulletin](#) indicates the data sources that we used.

The contract price information that underpins the analysis presented in the SSRO's statistical bulletins is information to which Schedule 5 of the Defence Reform Act 2014 applies. Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 prohibits disclosure of the information, except in circumstances specified in paragraphs 3 to 5 of that schedule. We consider that none of the exceptions apply to your request. As such, section 44(1)(a) of the FOI Act would apply to a request for that information, which is an absolute exemption and not subject to a public interest test.

You wrote to us on 30 March 2022 requesting a range of information pertaining to contracts referred to in our quarterly statistical bulletin published in February 2022. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

To date we have provided you with the requested information for 98 contracts, provided some of the requested information for a further 102 contracts and confirmed that all the requested information for a further 8 contracts is exempt from disclosure under the FOI Act. Since our last letter on 22 September we have continued to engage with external parties for the purpose of determining whether any exemption from disclosure should apply to the remaining information referred to in your request.

We are now able to confirm that we hold information for a further 63 contracts covered by your request. We have provided at Appendix 1 to this letter a table providing all or some of the requested information for these contracts.

- In 27 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 24 of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that doing so is required for the purposes of safeguarding national security. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against the risk that the disclosure would provide the UK's adversaries with insights about the UK's defence capability which would harm national security, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
- In 21 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 26(1)(a) of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the defence of the British Islands or of any colony. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against the risks that disclosure would be likely to prejudice the UK's defence policies, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
- In 39 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 26(1)(b) of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would prejudice or would be likely to prejudice the capability, effectiveness or security of the armed forces of the Crown. It is considered that disclosure would, or would be likely to, cause risk to the physical safety of armed forces or impairment to their ability to carry out their duties. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, having balanced the public interest in disclosing

the information against the risks identified above, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

- In 10 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 27(1)(a) of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would be likely to prejudice relations between the UK and other states. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, the effective conduct of international relations depends upon maintaining trust and confidence between governments. If the UK does not maintain this trust and confidence, its ability to protect and promote UK interests through international relations will be hampered, which will not be in the public interest. Having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against this risk, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
- In 5 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 41 of the FOI Act. The exemption is invoked on the basis that the information was provided in confidence. The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. This is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.
- In 32 case(s) we have determined that the requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 43(2) of the FOI Act. This exemption is invoked on the basis that release of the information would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Secretary of State for Defence and/or the defence contractors concerned. This is a qualified exemption subject to a public interest test. In applying this test we acknowledge the public interest in openness and transparency. However, where disclosure would make it less likely that defence contractors would provide the MOD with information in the future, or where disclosure would make it more difficult for the MOD or defence contractors to be able to conduct commercial transactions or have future dealings with each other without fear of suffering commercially as a result, these are factors that weigh in favour of maintaining the exemption. Having balanced the public interest in disclosing the information against this risk, it is considered that withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Please note that two of the data sources you requested are either not always used in preparing our bulletin (Date contract entered into – regulation 22(2)(h)) or are not used in preparing our bulletin (Total contract price – regulation 22(2)(k)). The methodology in the [bulletin](#) indicates the data sources that we used.

You wrote to us on 30 March 2022 requesting a range of information pertaining to contracts referred to in our quarterly statistical bulletin published in February 2022. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

To date we have provided you with the requested information for 82 contracts, provided some of the requested information for a further 111 contracts and confirmed that the information for a further 5 contracts is exempt from disclosure under the FOI Act. Since our last letter on 24 August we have continued to engage with external parties for the purpose of determining whether any exemption from disclosure should apply to the remaining information referred to in your request.

We have provided at Appendix 1 to this letter a table showing 31 contracts in respect of which a partial disclosure was made on 24 August. Where we have determined that there is no reason under the FOI Act to withhold information not previously disclosed in respect of those 31 contracts, the information is now provided. In some cases we have determined that certain items of the information requested are exempt from disclosure under the following sections of the FOI Act:

- 23(1) – The information relates to a security body listed in section 23(3) of the FOI Act. This is an absolute exemption and, as the information is not contained in a historical record, is not subject to a public interest test.
- 41 – The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. This is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.

We are also now able to confirm that we hold information for a further 10 contracts covered by your request.

- For 3 of the 10 contracts we have determined that the information you requested is exempt from disclosure under section 23(1) of the FOI Act. This is because it relates to a security body listed in section 23(3) of the FOI Act. As noted above, this is an absolute exemption and, as the information is not contained in a historical record, is not subject to a public interest test.
- For the other 7 contracts we have provided at Appendix 2 to this letter a table providing full or partial disclosure of the information we hold related to your request. In one case we have determined that an item of requested information is exempt from disclosure under section 41 of the FOI Act. The information was provided to us by another person and we consider its disclosure (otherwise than under the FOI Act) would constitute an actionable breach of confidence. As noted above, this is an absolute exemption and is not subject to a public interest test.

Please note that two of the data sources you requested are either not always used in preparing our bulletin (Date contract entered into – regulation 22(2)(h)) or are not used in preparing our bulletin (Total contract price – regulation 22(2)(k)). Subject: Review of your Freedom of Information Act request (reference RFI 058)

Thank you for your email dated 29 July, regarding your Freedom of Information (FOI) request. I have undertaken an Internal Review of how the SSRO has handled your request. I can confirm that I have not previously been involved in the handling of the FOI request, reference RFI 058.

You asked that the review covered the length of time it has taken for the SSRO to provide you with a response to your request, as you consider that by law the SSRO should have done so by this time. You also asked for a review of the approach that the SSRO has taken in applying the public interest test on the information that you have requested. My review considered:

- whether the SSRO's handling of your request and its approach to applying the public interest test has been appropriate in the circumstances; and
- ways in which the handling of this request might have been improved in order that learning can be applied in concluding the consideration of this request, and in processing future FOI requests.

I have concluded that the approach taken in applying the public interest test to the information that you have requested has been appropriate in the circumstances. Seeking the views of third parties has been necessary in order to ensure that the SSRO has the relevant information to determine which, if any, exemptions from disclosure may apply to the information requested and, for qualified exemptions, to undertake the public interest test.

There are, however, some aspects of the handling of this request that could have been dealt with more clearly as well as learning that the SSRO can apply in the handling of future FOI requests. I have made some recommendations which should help ensure that at least partial disclosure in relation to your request can be made to you in a more timely fashion. A full explanation of my conclusion is set out below.

Internal review of Freedom of Information request RFI 058: Findings

Background

Defence contractors are required to provide statutory reports to the SSRO and the Ministry of Defence (MOD) if they hold qualifying contracts under the regulatory framework. The Single Source Contract Regulations 2014 prescribe the types of reports, their contents and the circumstances in which they must be provided. The SSRO prepares and publishes quarterly statistics bulletins which present anonymised analysis of qualifying defence contracts (QDCs) and qualifying sub-contracts (QSCs), with information sourced from contract reports submitted by contractors and collated in the SSRO's Defence Contract Analysis and Reporting System (DefCARS). The scope of your request covers a range of information relating to QDCs and QSCs which had informed the analysis presented in the SSRO's Q3 2021/22 statistics bulletin published in February 2022.

The SSRO's [statement](#) on the handling of commercially sensitive information sets out how the SSRO handles the confidential and commercially sensitive information that it receives, as well as how it meets its obligations under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Approach to the public interest test

As a public authority, the SSRO is subject to the FOIA. Given the nature of the information held, it relies on relevant exemptions under the FOIA, where necessary, to ensure that inappropriate disclosure of information is prevented. The exemptions it considers most likely to apply include the following:

- Security Bodies (section 23);
- National Security (section 24);
- Defence (section 26);
- Information provided in confidence (section 41);
- Commercial interests (section 43(2)); and
- Prohibitions from disclosure (section 44).

The exemptions covered by sections 23, 41 and 44 are absolute exemptions and do not require application of a public interest test. However, the remaining exemptions listed are qualified exemptions, and this means that the SSRO must assess the balance of the public interest for and against disclosure.

Unlike most public authorities, the majority of the contract information the SSRO holds relates to contracts to which it is not a party. It generally has no knowledge of contract negotiations or the circumstances of the contractual arrangement between the MOD and each defence contractor, nor does it hold copies of the contracts. As explained above, the contract information upon which the SSRO's statistics bulletins are based is supplied to the SSRO pursuant to the statutory obligations of defence contractors who have qualifying contracts with the MOD. This means that the SSRO's ability, to (a) engage an exemption; and (b) carry out the public interest test in relation to qualified exemptions, is limited. It must rely on the provision of information to it by the contracting parties.

Sections 24, 26 and 43(2) provide qualified exemptions (subject to a public interest test) in respect of safeguarding national security, defence information and commercially sensitive information. This is where disclosure is likely to prejudice national security, the defence of the British Islands or of any colony, or the capability, effectiveness or security of any relevant forces, or the commercial interests of any person. When applying the public interest test, we are required to decide whether the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs that of disclosing the information. The arguments against need to outweigh those in favour to justify non-disclosure of the relevant information.

The SSRO's response to your request

Following receipt of your request dated 30 March 2022, the SSRO conducted an initial assessment of the information requested. This assessment concluded that the requested information was not information to which Schedule 5 of the Defence Reform Act 2014 applied and that the exemption which

permits withholding information if prohibited by an enactment under section 44(1)(a) of the FOIA could not, therefore, be engaged.

It considered that, on balance, at least one of the qualified exemptions may be engaged. Without further information, however, the SSRO's ability to determine whether or which other exemptions might apply, and whether the public interest test would favour disclosure was not possible. The SSRO therefore sought the views of the contracting parties for the purposes of confirming whether any appropriate exemption(s) applied and for obtaining information relevant to the public interest test.

Having reviewed your initial request, alongside the Cabinet Office's [FOI Code of Practice](#) (section 3, consultation with third parties) and the commitments made in the SSRO's statement on the handling of commercially sensitive information, I am satisfied that the approach of seeking the views of contracting parties was appropriate in the circumstances. This has been necessary in order to ensure that the SSRO has the relevant information to determine which, if any, relevant exemptions from disclosure may apply to the information requested and, for qualified exemptions, to undertake the public interest test.

I have reviewed the correspondence that was sent to you on 28 April 2022 and 30 May 2022. This stated that the SSRO considered it reasonable, under section 10(3) of the FOIA, to extend the time limit for it to respond. I have been informed that this was to allow the SSRO to gather the views of parties to the contracts as explained above, but I note that the correspondence made no reference to this reason. It was not until the SSRO's third letter of 29 June that such an explanation was provided.

I have recommended in future, where the SSRO is seeking information from third parties in order to comply with a freedom of information request, that correspondence makes clear the approach the SSRO intends to take, particularly where this may necessitate extending the deadline to respond to a request.

The time taken to respond

As explained above, the SSRO has sought the views of the relevant contract parties. This has involved email communication and telephone calls with the MOD and with over one hundred representatives of defence contractors holding QDCs or QSCs. In response to the views received, the following approach has been taken:

- where neither party to a contract raised any concerns about disclosure of the requested information in relation to a particular contract, the SSRO has disclosed the requested information about that contract without undertaking any further assessment.
- where one or both parties to a contract indicated a view that the information should not be disclosed, the SSRO has not disclosed the requested information pending its determination of whether (a) any relevant exemption(s) under the FOIA applied; and (b) for qualified exemptions, the public interest favours disclosure or maintaining the exemption.

I note that the SSRO has, to date, provided you with the information you requested in relation to a total of 82 contracts. It has also confirmed that the information requested in relation to a further five contracts is exempt from disclosure. For the remaining information, the SSRO has confirmed that it continues to engage with a number of external parties for the purposes of determining whether or not the balance of the public interest lies in maintaining one or more exemptions under Part II of the FOIA.

The FOIA provides that when an authority is not relying upon an exemption and does hold the requested information, it must issue the requester with written confirmation that the information is held and disclose the information. This must be done promptly and within 20 working days in accordance with section 10(1) of the FOIA. Section 10(3) enables an authority to extend the 20 working day time limit by a "reasonable" time in any case where:

- it requires more time to determine whether or not the balance of the public interest lies in maintaining an exemption; or

- it needs further time to consider whether it would be in the public interest to confirm or deny whether the information is held.

The FOIA does not provide a definition of what constitutes a “reasonable” extension of time. [Guidance](#) issued by the Information Commissioner’s Office (ICO) provides that an authority should normally take no more than an additional 20 working days to consider the public interest, meaning that the total time spent dealing with the request should not exceed 40 working days. An extension beyond this should be exceptional. However, the ICO’s guidance (at paragraph 62) further provides that examples of such exceptional circumstances could include “...exceptional levels of complexity involving a number of external parties”.

Given the number of contracts in respect of which you have requested information and the number of contracting parties involved, I am satisfied that the extensions of time applied to the standard 20 working day time limit have been necessary and, in the circumstances, reasonable.

I have reviewed the extensive correspondence that the SSRO has had with the representatives from defence contractors and with the MOD, in which it has sought the views of parties to the contracts as to whether there was a concern about the disclosure of any of the information you had requested. The status of each can be grouped into the following broad categories:

- both parties to the contract have responded and neither party has raised a concern about disclosure of the requested information;
- the MOD has responded and has not raised a concern, but there has been no response from the contractor;
- the contractor has responded and has not raised a concern, but there has been no response from the MOD;
- the MOD has responded and has not raised a concern, but the contractor has responded and has raised a concern about disclosure of one or more parts of the requested information;
- the contractor has responded and has not raised a concern, but the MOD has responded and has raised a concern about disclosure of one or more parts of the requested information; or
- neither party has responded.

In the cases where both parties have responded and neither party has raised a concern, this information has either already been released to you, or I am informed that it is to be released to you on or before 24 August 2022.

In the cases where the MOD has responded and has not raised a concern, but no response has been received from the contractor, I have recommended that this information should also be released to you on or before 24 August 2022. I have also recommended that, in future, a deadline is set with contractors and that contractors are reminded that beyond this date the SSRO will no longer seek their input.

The SSRO’s approach to date has been to release all of the requested information on a contract-by-contract basis, either when:

- it is satisfied that neither party has concerns about disclosure of the requested information; or
- it has concluded its consideration of whether any exemption should apply to any items of information in respect of which a party to the contract has raised a concern about disclosure and, in the case of qualified exemptions, whether the public interest favours disclosure.

This approach was determined to be administratively efficient for the SSRO. It is clear from my review of the third party responses received that outstanding information, or the outstanding assessment of information received, may only be limited to some elements of the requested information for a particular contract.

I have recommended that, in those cases where no concerns have been raised by either party in relation to elements of your request, information is released on or before 24 August 2022 on a partial disclosure basis. Where the partial information requested in relation to a particular contract subsequently becomes disclosable, that partial information can then be disclosed.

While this may make review of the information more complicated for you, it is more important that the information is disclosed as soon as possible once it has been determined that there is no reason not to do so, even if disclosure is made in a piecemeal fashion. This will mean that the SSRO should be a position by 24 August 2022 to release information to you, at least on a partial basis, in relation to over one hundred further contracts.

There remain, however, a significant number of cases where the MOD has not responded with the information requested and so the SSRO is unable to determine which, if any, relevant exemptions from disclosure may apply nor make any assessment of the public interest test. To date, the SSRO has routed all of its correspondence in relation to this request to a single policy team within the MOD. That team has, in turn, been seeking input from other teams in the MOD which have detailed knowledge of the contracts to which the requested information relates and are best placed to comment on whether any relevant exemption under the FOIA may apply.

I have recommended that the SSRO escalates the request for input beyond this policy team within the MOD. I have also recommended that the SSRO updates its policies in relation to handling FOI requests to identify escalation procedures to be followed in future. Additionally, in cases where input from the MOD is required, I have recommended that the MOD's FOI team is kept informed of requests that the SSRO receives and is subsequently kept updated of their status and progress.

Assessment of MOD and contractor responses

My review of third party responses to the SSRO's request for information has shown that, in many cases, those responses do not provide the information that the SSRO has requested. In some cases, it appears that there may be confusion about the information requested. This has necessitated the SSRO having to engage in protracted correspondence with the third party in order to clarify the information.

I have recommended that, in future, the SSRO makes clearer to those from whom it is seeking information as to the material and evidence it needs to assist it in assessing whether an exemption applies or, in the case of qualified exemptions, where the balance of public interest lies.

You wrote to us on 30 March 2022 requesting a range of information pertaining to contracts referred to in our quarterly statistical bulletin published in February 2022. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOI Act).

To date we have provided you with the requested information for 22 contracts. I can now confirm that we hold the information requested for a further 65 contracts whose data was aggregated in our Q3 2021/22 statistical bulletin.

In respect of 5 of these contracts, the information requested is exempt from disclosure under section 23(1) of the FOI Act. This is because it relates to a security body listed in section 23(3) of the FOI Act. This is an absolute exemption and, as the information is not contained in a historical record, is not subject to a public interest test.

For the other 60 contracts I attach an appendix with the information you requested.

Please note that two of the data sources you requested are either not always used in preparing our bulletin (Date contract entered into – regulation 22(2)(h)) or are not used in preparing our bulletin (Total contract price – regulation 22(2)(k)). The methodology in the [bulletin](#) indicates the data sources that we used.

The contract price information that underpins the analysis presented in the SSRO's statistical bulletins is information to which Schedule 5 of the Defence Reform Act 2014 applies. Paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 5 prohibits disclosure of the information, except in circumstances specified in paragraphs 3 to 5 of that schedule. We consider that none of the exceptions apply to your request. As such, section 44(1)(a) of the FOI Act would apply to a request for that information, which is an absolute exemption and not subject to the public interest test.

In some cases, the Total contract price information held by us and disclosed is zero. This may be because the information was not reported to us or because the contract is a framework contract in respect of which no contract price was agreed at the time the contract was entered into.

For the remaining information referred to in your request, it is necessary for us to further extend the time limit for a response to 24 August 2022. This is necessary owing to the need for us to engage with a large number of external parties for the purposes of determining whether or not the balance of the public interest lies in maintaining one or more of the following exemptions under Part II of the FOI Act:

- Section 24 National security
- Section 26 Defence
- Section 43 Commercial interests
