Thank you for your email of 4 July 2022 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

"1. For each of the last two financial years (20/21 and 21/22) please state how much was paid as part of the Continuity of Education Allowance (CEA), how many children this covered and how many service personnel were claiming the allowance.

2. For each of the last two financial years (20/21 and 21/22) please state (a) the average annual claim per service personnel for CEA and (b) the highest single claim.

3. For the last two financial years (20/21 and 21/22) can you provide me with the numbers of children given such an education for each rank of the armed services?

4. For each of the last two financial years (2020/21 and 21/22) please state how many children were educated at the following schools with the assistance of the Continuity of Education Allowance? (i) Eton, (ii) Winchester, (iii) Roedean, (iv) Fettes, (v) Radley, (vi) Wellington and (vii) Gordonstoun.

5. For each of the last two financial years (20/21 and 2021/22) please provide me with a list of the 10 schools where the MoD had the biggest spend in relation to the Continuity of Education Allowance. Please provide the name of the school and the amount the MoD spent at the school to provide, subsidised places for MoD employees' children.

6. What are the is current maximum that can be claimed annually under the various categories of the Continuity of Education Allowance?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held. However, in order to protect personal information governed by Data Protection Legislation, Section 40(2) of the FOIA has been applied to some of the information by supplementing numbers less than 5 with a tilde (~). Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

Please find the enclosed Annex A which provides information in answer to questions 1 to 5 of your request.

In answer to question 6, it is a condition of Continuity of Education Allowance (CEA) that the claimant must make a <u>minimum</u> parental contribution of 10% of the boarding and tuition fees in respect of each child for whom they claim the allowance. Any outstanding fees following receipt of the allowance maximum must be met by the claimant.

The table below shows the maximum amounts that can be claimed for each category of CEA:

The boundary between junior and senior rates of CEA depends on the school; however, generally, junior rates of CEA are paid for children in Years 3 to 6, while senior rates are paid for children in Years 7 to 13.

Under Section 16 (Advice and Assistance) you may be interested to know that the new rates of Education Allowance are to be implemented on 1 August 2022.
